

## **SUGGESTED CEREMONY 50-YEAR SERVICE AWARD**

*The High Priest of the Chapter or any Past High Priest is qualified to conduct the 50-Year Service Award ceremony. The ceremony may be conducted in a Chapter that has been regularly opened and is at labor. Wives and friends may be invited into the Chapter during the ceremony. The ceremony may also be conducted at special meetings of a Chapter such as a social meeting. The conductor will designate Companions to act as Chaplain, Captain of the Host, and Secretary (these may be the installed officers or, for the purposes of the ceremony, non-officers).*
