

# Biographical

#### ROY ALLEN WELSHON, SR. Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri 2002-2003

Roy Allen Welshon was born May 2, 1932 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, the son of Leslie and Rita (Glesius) Welshon. He was educated in the De Soto, Missouri public schools and various trade schools. He was united in marriage to Marcella Taylor on April 26, 1951. They have three children: Roy Allen Jr. (Laraine), Kathy (Randall Davis), and Edward Scott (Christy). Six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren currently bless their lives. Roy served his country in the Missouri National Guard from 1950 to 1963, attaining the rank of Staff Sergeant. Most Excellent Companion Welshon retired in July 1994 after 30 years as General Manager of Public Water Supply District # 10 in Jefferson County, Missouri. He is a member of the First Baptist Church in De Soto, Missouri.

# ADDRESS OF MOST WORSHIPFUL BROTHER JIMMIE D. LEE

Investments in common stock or equal securities in nationally known corporations traded on the New York Stock Exchange, as allowed by Sec. 44 of the By-Laws is being utilized (Commerce Bank, Special Account and Investor Services at Central Bank). Based on previous ledgers, general fund receipts and expenditures are being projected on a monthly basis, so as to keep investments at the highest practical level for the longest practical time frame.

#### REPORTS OF GRAND SECRETARY

#### SUMMARY

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri:

Companions, we are not there yet but things are beginning to shape up. Joyce has been working with each Chapter trying to clean up the membership records—it is a big job and we appreciate your help. In mid to late summer we will be moving the membership database into the new database software program developed for the Grand York Rite. From this new database, we will be able to have a much better handle on all forms of membership and recognition programs. We hope to be able to generate veteran membership certificates without your request based on due dates; help Chapters keep track of their membership; and start working on preprinted annual returns.

At the time of this communication, we are still waiting on annual returns from Hannibal No. 7, Linn No. 41, Clinton No. 73, Oriental No. 78, George F. Gouley No. 90, Owens No. 96, and Kingsway No. 144. Linn Chapter No. 41 has not filed an annual return for 2000 or 2001; Clinton Chapter No. 73 has not filed an annual return for 2001; and Owens Chapter No. 96 did not file and annual return for 2001. understands that there are new Secretaries, but would strongly suggest the Chapters who have not filed an annual report for 2000 or 2001 be put on notice.

Fifteen annual reports were late this year, the last being received on April 30th. Companions, it is all but impossible for the office to be able to complete necessary tasks and provide membership information if the returns are not on time. I would encourage to the Grand Chapter officers to consider the actions of the Grand Council who passed legislation which revokes voting privileges of those Councils who have not submitted an annual return by February 8<sup>th</sup> of each year with all fees paid. There must be some form of motivation to get the returns in on time.

With regard to fees, Liberty Chapter No. 3 has refused to pay late fees due for 2000 and 2001. All other Chapters are working with the Grand Secretary's office with regards to fees and corrections in annual returns.

Fifteen Chapters report that their Treasurer and Secretary are bonded. Several Chapters have reported that the funds of the Chapter are NOT deposited into an account with at least two signatures. High Priests and officers are reminded that this needs to be rectified as soon as possible.

The following Chapters either failed to perform an annual audit, the audit was incomplete, or the seal of the Chapter was not affixed: St. Louis-Missouri No. 1, Independence No. 12, Mitchell No. 14, Springfield No. 15, Lone Star No. 30, Rolla No. 32, Greenfield No. 38, Orion No. 49, Tyrian No. 52, Caldwell No. 53, Ralls No. 55, California No. 58, Lebanon No. 64, Signet No. 68, Wilson No. 75, Oriental No. 78, Bethany No. 80, Joplin No. 91, Orient No. 102, Vincil No. 110, Putnam No. 123, Centennial No. 141, and Grandview No. 145. In accordance with Grand Chapter law, Article XII, Section 104A, Annual Audit, said audit is mandatory. Were this law not in existence, many Chapters would never perform an audit. The seal affixed to the bottom of the annual audit is certification that the Chapter is in charge of its seal. It is in the best interest of the Chapter and its officers that the audit be performed annually and to completion.

It is very difficult to express how unfortunate it is to receive and review some of the annual returns: Secretaries choose not to complete all the information, the information provided is sometimes grossly incorrect, mathematical computations are in error, audits are either barely touched or not at all and much information is simply missing. These deficient returns will be audited, subjected to known corrections, and returned to the Chapters for follow-up action. Officers are reminded that they should take more time and care in the completion of their returns.

Exaltation Certificates: The Grand High Priest has determined that the office will issue Exaltation Certificates for all new candidates at no charge provided that the Secretaries make the request and get the information in to the Grand Secretary. We have agreed that this is the least we can do to acknowledge our new members and the cost is minimal.

Chapter Activity reports were developed in 2001 in order to provide up to date information on membership statewide. To those that are keeping up with these reports, we thank you. However, many Chapters do not submit the reports and it has been suggested that Secretaries do not have to do this at all. Please do not put us in a position to propose a change in the law to make the submission of the report mandatory. I assure you, the report is necessary for the evolution of annual returns, for us to be able to track demits and suspensions, to keep track of current officers for proper mailings, and to help Secretaries and Recorders keep track of their membership. Chapter Secretaries and Council and Commandery Recorders do not communicate with each other very well when it comes to tracking their membership. Although Grand Chapter law requires it, it would be almost impossible for them to do this; the responsibility should therefore fall onto this office. We require the information in order to be able to preprint the annual returns—all of this will make the Secretary's job much easier in the end. This is where we are headed and we need your help to make it happen.

Gallatin No. 11 consolidated with Trenton No. 66 on December 19, 2002.

The format of the 2002 proceedings was modified to provide for a document which is more organized and easier to navigate. There were more pictures included which made for a larger document and this is not without cost. The Grand Chapter should determine, in its wisdom, if this is necessary or worthwhile. I would suggest, for historical reasons, it is. As the cost of printing the proceedings will increase somewhat from year to year, it

might be suggested to charge the Order of High Priesthood and other bodies for a share of the expenses equal to their coverage in the document. Estimated costs would run about \$20.00 per page. Although this amount is not very significant, it could save the bodies some money.

In the new proceedings, we have removed the address and personal information from each of the multiple listings of individuals normally found throughout the document and moved them to the end of the book in a directory. We feel this is much easier for the writing of the document and provides for a user-friendly reference section in the back of the book.

We have moved the printing of the document to Columbia where we can work hand in hand with the printer in resolving any issues which may arise. We are now using the same printer used by the Grand Lodge for their proceedings.

Joyce and I thank the Grand High Priest and all the Grand Chapter officers for a most enjoyable and productive year. It has been a pleasure to work with MEC Welshon and all of the officers. We would also thank the officers and members of the Chapters for working with us as we try to move onward and upward. We look forward to working with all of you in the future.

#### SUPPLEMENTAL

#### 2003 Proceedings

The Grand Secretary addressed the Grand Convocation regarding the printing of the proceedings and the costs related thereto. It was agreed to keep the pictures and current format. Following discussion, it was moved by the Grand Secretary and seconded that future proceedings be printed and distributed as usual to the Chapters and Grand Officers, but those proceedings to be distributed to other jurisdictions and to those that request it, be distributed on CD to help reduce the cost of the printing.

# Proposed Legislation Laid Over from 2002

The following proposed legislation was corrected from Article X to Article IX.

# Proposed Amendment to ARTICLE IX, Sec. 41

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri:

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Article IX, Sec. 41, Fiscal Year, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri, be amended as follows: By replacing the words, "March 31st" with "May 31st".

**THIS SECTION OF THE BY-LAWS CURRENT READS:** The statistical year of the Grand Chapter shall end on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December of each year, but the books and accounts of the Grand Chapter shall be closed and balanced as of March 31<sup>st</sup>.

**IF ADOPTED, THIS SECTION WOULD READ:** The statistical year of the Grand Chapter shall end on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December of each year, but the books and accounts of the Grand Chapter shall be closed and balanced as of May 31<sup>st</sup>.

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** It is inappropriate for the Grand Treasurer and Grand Secretary to continue paying the expenses of the Grand Chapter after the fiscal year is completed and prior to the approval of the new budget without special consideration and approval by the Committee on Finance and Accounts for each expenditure.

It is therefore necessary to set the fiscal year of the Grand Chapter to include the expenses currently involved in operating the Grand Chapter from April 1<sup>st</sup> through and including the Annual Convocation. By moving to May 31at, all fiscal obligations for the Grand Chapter year will be the responsibility of the same core of officers and committeemen.

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** It is inappropriate that the Jurisprudence Committee should be expected to review and prepare legislation coming before a Grand Session when its first knowledge of its existence is on the very day it is to be proposed. The Jurisprudence Committee must have time to review and analyze the content of a proposal to assure accuracy, proper format and to assure the Grand Chapter Line Officers that it does not conflict with existing By-Laws.

**THE BY-LAW CURRENTLY READS:** Any alteration or proposition to amend or repeal any of the foregoing by-laws shall be reduced to writing and read on one day of the session, be published in the Proceedings of the Grand Chapter and lay over until the next annual convocation, when it shall again be read, and if approved by a majority of the members present, shall become a part of the by-laws of this Grand Chapter.

**IF AMENDED THE SECTION WILL READ:** Article XXVIII, Change of By-Laws, Section 224. Alteration or Repeal. Any alteration or proposition to amend or repeal any of the by-laws shall be reduced to writing and if approved by a majority of the members present, shall become a part of the by-laws of this Grand Chapter.

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** In this day and age of electronic media, it is no longer necessary and in most cases is inconvenient and cumbersome to require such legislation to lie over an additional year.

# Proposed Legislation to Lay Over to 2004

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri:

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Article VI, Grand Secretary, Section 33-A, Retirement Plan, be repealed in its entirety.

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** To save the Grand Chapter money and to prevent the raising of per capita in the future, seeing how the Grand Chapter has \$100,000.00 plus in the retirement fund. The Secretary's position is meant to be a job that will supplement his income, not one from which he can retire.

# **THIS SECTION OF THE BY-LAWS CURRENTLY READS:** Article VI, Grand Secretary, Section 33-A, Retirement Plan.

- (a) After serving not less than one hundred twenty (120) months as a full time employee of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, of Missouri, such employee may at his option retire from said employment on or before May 1 next after becoming 65 years of age, or at any time thereafter, and shall then receive the retirement pension hereinafter provided.
- (b) The employee who retires as hereinafter provided shall be paid an annual pension equivalent to the number of years of his service multiplied by 1½ percent of his average annual salary of the highest five (5) years, provided that in no event shall the retirement pension payments exceed 50 per cent of the annual salary being received by such employee at the time of his retirement.
- (c) No retirement payments shall be paid to any such employee who retires prior to becoming 65 years of age or with less than 120 months of service, unless while serving such employee shall become totally and permanently disabled. "Totally and permanently disabled" shall be comparable to that as defined and determined in the Social Security Act.
- (d) That a pension plan be now established in the Grand Chapter to make available at any necessary future time a partial source of funds.
- (e) That the Finance Committee be authorized now and until further action of any future Grand Chapter Annual Convocation, to provide any sum necessary to sustain the fund at its current investment principal to be placed in said fund for investment in U.S. Government Securities and that all earned interest accruing to the benefit of said fund shall remain in said fund with the exception of those monies expended for payment to any retirees.
- (f) The adoption of this section and the provisions therein contained shall not give any person, or persons, any vested right. The right is reserved to amend, modify or repeal any or all parts of this section for any reason at all.
- **IF REPEALED THE SECTION WILL CEASE TO EXIST.** The following recommendation of disbursement of the retirement fund is to divide it into four equal parts, putting one fourth in the first year into the General Investments Fund; one fourth the second year; one fourth the third year; and etc.; so as not to bring questions from the Internal Revenue Service. If adopted this should keep the Grand Chapter from raising per capita for several years in the future.

# Proposed Legislation to Lay Over to 2004

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri:

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Article VI, Grand Secretary, Section 33-A, Retirement Plan, of the By-laws of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons be amended as follows:

1. By striking paragraph (e) and inserting a new paragraph.

Paragraph (e) currently states, "That the Finance Committee be authorized now and until further action of any future Grand Chapter Annual Convocation, to provide any sum necessary to sustain the fund at its current investment principal to be placed in said fund for investment in U.S. Government Securities and that all earned interest accruing to the benefit of said fund shall remain in said fund with the exception of those monies expended for payment to any retirees".

New paragraph 12 would state, "That the Finance Committee be authorized now and until further action of any future Grand Chapter Annual Convocation, to provide any sum necessary to sustain the fund at its current investment principal to be placed in said fund for investment and that all earnings accruing to the benefit of said fund shall remain in said fund with the exception of those monies expended for payment to retirees".

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** Currently, the principal of the retirement fund must be invested in U.S. Government Securities. By removing this requirement, it would allow the retirement funds to be invested in accordance with the requirements of Article IX, Section 44, Investments. Thus, a portion of the funds would be able to potentially achieve higher rates of return than available for U.S. Government Securities.

The Jurisprudence Committee notes that if the preceding piece of legislation passes, this piece of legislation will be moot. The Jurisprudence Committee also notes that there is no paragraph 12 in section 33-A; however, there is a paragraph (e) of the same wording. The Jurisprudence Committee further notes that the proposal is in error in its present form. First, if subsection (e) is struck (repealed), the wording of the proposal cannot then be substituted as paragraph (e). Second, a paragraph does not go away at repeal.

The Jurisprudence Committee offers the following:

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Article VI, Grand Secretary, Section 33-A, Retirement Plan, paragraph (e) of the by-laws of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri, be amended by striking the words, "U.S. Government Securities".

As amended, paragraph (e) will then read, "That the Finance Committee be authorized, now and until further action of any future Grand Chapter Annual Convocation, to provide any sum necessary to sustain the fund at its current investment principle to be placed in said fund for investment and that all earnings accruing to the benefit of said fund shall remain in said fund with the exception of those monies expended for payment to retirees".

The Statement of Purpose remains the same.

# Proposed Legislation to Lay Over to 2004

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri:

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Article XVIII, Life Membership, Section 164, of the Bylaws of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri, be amended as follows:

1. By striking paragraph 12 and inserting a new paragraph.

Paragraph 12 currently states, "The Grand Secretary shall annually remit to the recorders of participating constituent Chapters their prorated portion of the earnings of the Life Membership Fund, less the par capita tax in effect when the member became a Life Member."

New paragraph 12 would state, "The Grand Secretary shall annually remit to the Secretaries of participating constituent Chapters their prorated portion of the earnings of the Life Membership Fund minus per capita. This is provided that no earnings shall be distributed on any Life Membership until January 1 of the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) calendar year after such fee, paid in full, is deposited with the Grand Secretary. When a Life Member dies, the Grand Chapter will continue to receive his per capita, less 20% and his Chapter will continue to receive his prorated earnings, less 20%. The retained 20% will be added to the Funds principal to provide for growth in the Fund. Prorated earnings shall be based on the member's chapter dues that existed at the time the individual entered the Life Membership Program. Per capital shall be the per capita that existed at the time the individual entered the Life Membership Program."

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** Currently the fund must achieve annual earnings in excess of 5  $\frac{1}{2}$ % in order to provide for a 100% distribution. By establishing a minimum of one (1) year for the earnings from any new Life Membership investment (participant), it allows the investment to have earnings for at least a full year, prior to them being involved in the earnings distribution. Thusly, the distribution to prior membership will not be reduced in order to make up for the short term investment earnings from the new members. The principal of the fund must grow in order to provide for greater earnings. The return of 20% of a deceased members earnings to the principal of the fund will allow for growth in the fund, without greatly hampering the Grand Chapter and constituent Chapters.

The Jurisprudence Committee notes error in this piece of legislation similar to that of the preceding proposal, that is deleting (repealing) then attempting to insert new wording under the same section. In this particular case, paragraph 12 could be amended to include the added wording. The committee suggests the following:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Article XVIII, Life Membership, Section 164, Subsection 12, of the By-laws of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri, be amended by changing "recorders" to "secretaries", striking "less the per capita tax in effect when the member became a life member", substituting "minus per capita" in its place, placing a period (.) after "capita", and adding the following wording, "This is provided that no earnings shall be distributed on any Life Membership until after January 1 of the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) calendar year after such fee, paid in full, is deposited with the Grand Secretary. When a Life Member dies, the Grand Chapter will continue to receive his per capita, less 20% and his Chapter will continue to receive his prorated earnings, less 20%. The retained 20% will be added to the Fund's principal to provide for growth in the fund. Prorated earnings shall be based on the member's chapter dues that existed at the time the individual entered the Life Membership Program. Per capita shall be the per capita that existed at the time the individual entered the Life Membership Program."

IF AMENDED THIS SECTION WOULD READ: Article XVIII, Life Membership, Section 164, Subsection 12, "The Grand Secretary shall annually remit to the Secretaries of participating subordinate chapters their prorated portion of the earnings of the Life Membership Fund minus per capita. This is provided that no earnings shall be distributed on any Life Membership until after January 1 of the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) calendar year after such fee, paid in full, is deposited with the Grand Secretary. When a Life Member dies, the Grand Chapter will continue to receive his per capita, less 20% and his Chapter will continue to receive his prorated earnings, less 20%. The retained 20% will be added to the Fund's principal to provide for growth in the fund. Prorated earnings shall be based on the member's chapter dues that existed at the time the individual entered the Life Membership Program. Per capita shall be the per capita that existed at the time the individual entered the Life Membership Program.

The Statement of Purpose remains the same.

# Proposed Legislation to Lay Over to 2004

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri:

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Article XVIII, Life Membership, Section 164, of the Bylaws of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri, be amended as follows:

1. By striking paragraph 2 and inserting a new paragraph.

Paragraph 2 currently states, "Any member may purchase a life membership using the following method of computing the fee. Divide his chapter dues by 5% (or multiply by 20) and this will be the cost of a Life Membership if purchased between January 1 and June 30, if purchased after June 30, add one year's dues."

"All formulas shall be reviewed annually by the Committee on Life Membership, and if needed to be changed, submitted in writing in accordance with Article XXVII, Change of By-Laws."

New paragraph 2 would state, "Any member may purchase a life membership by computing the fee as 20 times the member's Chapter dues at time of purchase of said life membership, provided that no life membership fee shall be less than \$300.00."

2. By deleting paragraph 15.

Paragraph 15 currently states, "The Committee of the Life Membership Program shall be empowered to establish a minimum fee for Life Membership. However, the minimum fee shall not be less than \$150.00. These fees shall be reviewed annually by the Committee of the Life Membership Program and a report made to the annual convocation."

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: It is our understanding that the purpose of having a member pay an additional year's dues, who purchased a Life Membership after June 30, was due to the fact that the Grand Chapter could not generate a return on that Life Membership in less than six months time. Therefore, the additional year's dues should not have been part of the endowment, but used as a part of the earnings for distribution for that year. However, due to the wording of the existing by-law, additional year's dues were deposited as part of the principal of the fund. This has not been all bad, as it has allowed for some growth in the fund, but in turn has caused unnecessary paperwork, confusion, and concern with the many secretaries of the constituent Chapters.

The necessary items in paragraph 15 are adequately covered elsewhere in this section and need not be duplicated.

By establishing an increased minimum participation fee, doing away with the additional year's dues, and eliminating paperwork, it will provide for growth in the fund, while being less confusing for the Chapters and ease the management of the fund by the Grand Chapter.

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Article XVIII, Life Membership, Section 164, paragraph 2, of the by-laws of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri, be amended (1) by striking all after "membership" and substituting, "by computing the fee as 20 times the member's Chapter dues at the time of purchase of said life membership,

provided that no life membership fee shall be less than \$300.00. All formulas shall be reviewed annually by the Committee on Life Membership, and if need to be changed, submitted in writing in accordance with Article XXVIII, Change of By-laws", and

(2) by repeal of paragraph 15.

IF ADOPTED, the wording of paragraph 15 will no longer exist. Paragraph 2 will then read, "Any member may purchase a life membership by computing the fee as 20 times the member's Chapter dues at the time of purchase of said life membership, provided that no life membership fee shall be less than \$300.00. All formulas shall be reviewed annually by the Committee on Life Membership, and if need to be changed, submitted in writing in accordance with Article XXVIII, Change of By-laws.

The Statement of Purpose will remain the same.

**Delete Section 1. Annual Convocations** in its entirety.

#### Add Section 1. Annual Convocations as follows:

The annual convocation of this Grand Chapter shall be held on the day immediately prior to the annual conclave of the Grand Commandery, beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the City of Columbia or Jefferson City, provided that time of the next succeeding annual convocation may be changed by a majority vote of the Grand Chapter at any annual convocation, or as provided for in the Constitution, as amended in Article V, Section 1.

Section 1."

The Statement of Purpose remains the same.



#### REVIEW AND HISTORICAL COMMITTEE

#### The Period 1846 – 1860

"The period 1846 to 1860 is probably one of the most important periods of Royal Arch Masonry History in Missouri. It is the formative period, a period always filled with danger, requiring safe counsel, wise minds, and constructive ability. Missouri was fortunate in having many men possessing these qualities in a large degree, and to them is to be given whatever credit may be due for having built a foundation which was firm and satisfactory(1).

There were many difficulties to be surmounted in the organization of a Grand Chapter, and it was a matter in which few of the membership were at all acquainted, most of them had had, or were having experience in connection with the management of the affairs of the Grand Lodge. Some of the founders of Royal Arch Masonry were founders of the Grand Lodge; they had an excellent knowledge of Masonic jurisprudence as then constituted. The organization was not so large as to be unwieldy, and its problems were not so momentous as not to be handled with a limited amount of knowledge and discretion. A Constitution had to be made, (it was made toward the end of the period and consisted of but twenty words), By-Laws written, new officers elected, the Grand Chapter must be incorporated, it must have a ritual, it must have jewels and certain other required paraphernalia, it must have means for carrying on its finances, its proceedings must be printed. There were no precedents for these in Missouri and the companions found it necessary to copy customs and precedents which were in force in other Jurisdictions. The principal matters which confronted the Grand Chapter were outside problems, our relationship with the General Grand Chapter of the United States, the selection of constitutional degrees, for there were many who thought the degrees of Royal and Select Masters were part of the Capitular system, others thought the Past Master Degree should be abolished, for it was then being conferred on actual Masters of Lodges by those who were not members of Chapters, and again the Grand Lodge had been engaged in the work of building a Masonic College and had proposed a Grand Masonic Temple for the City of St. Louis, and these problems were also before the Grand Chapter.

The period was not one of material growth; the Grand Chapter had had a small beginning, its organization being effected by four Chapters – Missouri Chapter No. 1, Palmyra Chapter No. 2, Boonville Chapter No. 5, and Fayette Chapter No. 6. At that time, the total membership of Royal Arch Masonry in Missouri scarcely exceeded the 200 mark. In 1852, the membership was 271, and on May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1860, it had only increased to 882, although 31 Chapters had been chartered. The first Annual Communication of the Grand Chapter of Missouri was held in the Masonic Hall in St. Louis on Friday, October 16<sup>th</sup>, 1846, and was presided over by Elihu Shepard with S. Buckner acting as Secretary. John D. Daggett, one of the best-known Masons of his day, submitted a resolution, unanimously adopted, which provided:

"Whereas there being now within the State of Missouri four regular Royal Arch Chapters duly constituted, with a large and rapidly increasing number of Royal Arch Masons desirous of constituting other chapters,

"Therefore be it resolved that we, the officers and proxies of the chapters aforesaid, deeming it expedient and necessary for the better government of the craft, do now establish and constitute a Grand Royal Arch Chapter for the State of Missouri, agreeably

to the provisions of the Constitution of the General Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the United States."

On the following day, the matter of By-Laws occupied the attention of the Convention and a committee which had been appointed to draft such a code presented its report, recommending the adoption of the By-Laws of the Grand Chapter of South Carolina, with such alterations and amendments as might be necessary and expedient. (It was noted by Denslow in the writing of this section that they had been unable to "discover" the South Carolina By-Laws and could not state as to the character of the alterations and amendments. These rules and regulations appear in the proceedings of 1847, as well as in the reprint. They consisted of fourteen pages of finely printed matter, the various sections being referred to as *Rules* instead of articles. Rule I specified the officers of the Grand Chapter and its membership. Masters of Veils were not included; the elective officers were Grand High Priest, Deputy Grand High Priest, Grand King, Grand Scribe, Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Chaplain, and Grand Marshal. The title of the Grand Chapter was "Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Missouri."

Rule 2 provided that one regular meeting should be held annually, in St. Louis, on the first Wednesday after the second Monday in October, and three Chapters should constitute a quorum.

Rule 3 provided for the election of officers at the Annual Convocation. Only High Priests, past or present, were eligible to vote with the exception of Grand Secretary, Grand Chaplain, and Grand Outdoor Sentinel. The only Standing Committees under this rule were Unfinished Business, Chapters and Lodges, Secretary's and Treasurer's Books and Grievances.

Rules 4, 5, 6, and 7 specified the duties of the Grand High Priest, the Grand Treasurer, Grand Secretary, and the Grand Sentinel.

Rule 8 provided for the revenues of the Grand Chapter, consisting of \$2.00 exaltation fee, \$1.00 per capita tax and a \$90.00 fee for charter.

Rule 9 provided for a diploma certifying Royal Arch membership signed by the four principal officers of the Grand Chapter and certified to by the Grand Secretary. The price was \$2.00 if on parchment and \$1.00 if on paper.

Rule 10 concerned the manner of voting. Each Chapter was entitled to three votes.

Rule 11 consisted of rules of order.

Rule 12 specified the method of election in subordinate Chapters.

Rule 13 legalized the use of proxies.

Rule 14 required the making out of annual returns, with penalties in the event of failure.

Rule 15 required each Chapter to assemble at least once in every three months. A Chapter neglecting to meet for one year forfeited its charter.

Rule 16 fixed jurisdiction.

Rule 17 concerned the admittance of members and visitors.

Rule 18 fixed the method of expulsion.

Rules 19 and 20 provided for subordinate Chapter By-Laws and the amendment of the Grand Chapter By-Laws.

#### 1847

James W. S. Mitchell, who presided at the 1847 Convocation, referred to at that time as "Communication" reported verbally:

"As Grand High Priest I attended in person the Triennial meeting of the General Grand Chapter of the United States recently held at Columbus, Ohio; that this Grand Chapter had been formally recognized as such and that he had been admitted to his seat as a representative thereof in that body as would, in due time, appear in the printed proceedings of that body."

Mitchell tells us:

"I had looked forward with great interest to that Convocation, expecting to meet brethren, not only of the higher order of intellect, but prepared to disseminate true Masonic light. Judge then, my surprise at witnessing an abortive attempt to open the General Grand Chapter. Two or three times did the officers try to use the ceremony, without success, and finally the General Grand High Priest declared that body opened. Alas, how often does distance lend enchantment to the view and high places presuppose high attainments?"

Mitchell reported that he had granted dispensations to Chapters at Brunswick and Lexington. Hannibal and St. Louis Chapters, which had been chartered by the General Grand Chapter, received their charters during this period and were admitted as members of the Missouri Grand Chapter.

A committee was appointed to report at the Convocation a series of work and lectures covering the Chapter Degrees. Foster and Mitchell were the leading members of this committee.

A charter was granted to Brunswick Chapter No. 9.

Cross' chart was made the official textbook for Chapters in the Jurisdiction, all others being interdicted. Billon, Carnegy and Daggett were made a committee to procure a seal "with appropriate devices."

#### 1848

Grand High Priest Mitchell was not present at the opening of the 1848 "Communication," no doubt, for good and sufficient reasons, as will later be discovered. Joseph Megguier presided. The committee charged with procuring a seal reported the purchase of a suitable seal at an expense of \$17.50. Charters were granted to Lexington Chapter No. 10, Jefferson Chapter No. 11, and Independence Chapter No. 12.

Mitchell's failure to be present may have been due to his being involved in financial matters. (Mitchell's wife died April 9, 1848, and he began the publication of his "Masonic Signet" in May 1848, which may have accounted for his financial inability to pay.) The Committee on Accounts reported that it had received \$450.00 for five dispensations granted during a two year period and recommended the appointment of a committee to call on Mitchell for a report of his official duties and to receive whatever money he may have collected belonging to the Grand Chapter. The committee also decided it was poor policy to collect the monies for dispensations, and recommended that applications made thereafter should be made direct to the Grand Secretary.

A committee was appointed to procure appropriate jewels for the officers of the Grand Chapter.

Megguier proposed a resolution providing for the appointment of a committee of three to inquire in the conduct of Companion Mitchell and prefer charges against him. If the votes elicited justified it, he was ordered to appear before the Grand Chapter at its next Communication, the vote being 15 aye's and 5 no's.

Dispensations granted to Columbia and Huntsville Chapters were continued. The time of meeting was changed from October to May, and since only seven months intervened until the next Annual Communication, subordinate Chapters were only required to pay one-half the amount of dues for their members, as required by law. The Grand Secretary was allowed \$75.00 and the Grand Sentinel \$10.00.

Rev. Thomas H. Capers, who was elected Grand High Priest, not being in attendance, signified, in a note, his acceptance and his installation was ordered at a time and place convenient to himself. The manner of his installation is told in a statement of John D. Daggett, Deputy Grand High Priest, charged with the duty of installation:

"After the meeting of the Grand Chapter in October last, having waited a reasonable time in expectation of seeing Reverend Companion Capers, who had signified his acceptance of office as Grand High Priest to which he had been elected, I invited Companion Melody to join me in a call upon his residence, some miles from the city, where we learned he had been confined, with some members of his family, by sickness. I then and there, in pursuance of a resolution of the Grand Chapter, adopted October 14, 1848, proceeded to install him Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Missouri. Since then I have not seen him or acted with him in any official acts, but only that of the appointment of Grand Lecturer, which was conferred upon Companion Melody."

### 1849

The Capers administration was an unsatisfactory one, his sole official act appeared to consist in the appointment of Companion Melody as Grand Lecturer, an act forced upon him at the time of his installation. He did not appear at the 1849 "Communication" and the Grand Chapter was opened by the Deputy Grand High Priest, John D. Daggett. Capers never again appeared at Grand Chapter. He was, no doubt selected because of his many attainments. He was educated for the practice of medicine, abandoning it to become a minister of the Methodist Episcopal Church. He rose to great prominence in his Church, and, in 1846, was transferred to St. Louis in charge of Centenary M.E. Church. He was later called to Jefferson City, but because of his health, purchased a farm near Bellefontaine, in St. Louis County, and engaged in the practice of medicine. He remained in Missouri only a few years.

On the third day of the Annual Convocation, the minutes stated that no quorum was present on account of the great fire that occurred on the night before. A steamboat at the wharf took fire, which was communicated to a number of others and thence to buildings on Front or Water Street, which swept everything in its way, crossed Main Street and up to Second Street, destroying a number of blocks on each of those streets. Only blowing up some buildings checked its progress. J.W.S. Mitchell's office (he was then publishing the "Masonic Signet") was destroyed. Mitchell, himself, had been present on the day preceding the fire, the Proceedings stating:

"Present, in addition to yesterday, P.M.E.G.H.P., J.W.S. Mitchell."

The Committee, which was to report on the Mitchell matter, made up a statement allowing Mitchell for certain expenses, but "failed to make a satisfactory settlement with him, on account of his inability to pay over the funds or to procure the treasury receipt for same." Mitchell stated to the Grand Chapter that he was prepared and would pay to the Grand Chapter \$200.00 in cash and the balance in twelve months. His proposition was accepted.

George H. C. Melody was allowed \$200.00 for his services as Grand Lecturer.

The Committee on Foreign Correspondence, of which Joseph Foster was chairman, referred to the condition of the Royal and Select Degrees. He did not view the matter seriously, as did many Grand Chapters, who believed that the existence of the whole fraternity was staked on that single issue.

### 1850

The Masonic College matter was first proposed to the Grand Chapter at the Annual Convocation in this year. Joseph Foster was the author of a resolution (which recognized the act of the Grand Lodge in creating the Institution), presenting the endowment of the preparatory department with an annual income of not less than \$1,500.00. In order to secure the support of St. Louis Companions, it was found necessary to embody as a part of the resolution, a section providing for the erection of a Grand Masonic Hall in the City of St. Louis. (Ex. Comp. Chiles believes the college and hall propositions grew out of the anti-Masonic troubles, and that no "log-rolling" methods were employed.) The Foster resolutions were unanimously adopted.

The Grand Lecturer was loaned \$200.00 upon the assignment of his life policy as security.

### 1851

The Masonic College and Hall matter occupied the attention of the Convocation. Richard R. Rees offered a resolution construing the action of the Grand Chapter, by which the Grand Chapter or any subordinate Chapter was not to be held responsible for the sum specified therein. The Masonic Hall Committee reported that it had secured a charter and it was accepted.

Charters were granted to Monroe and Springfield Chapters.

Archibald Patterson, President of the College, reported from Lexington that he had represented the Grand Chapter at the General Grand Chapter in Boston, September 1850. The Grand Chapter appropriated \$100.00 towards his expenses, the Curators of the College paying the remainder.

Companion Foster presented the jewels which had been purchased at an expense of \$81.00.

The Grand Secretary's report for the year contains an item – "paper, 75 cents; ink and quills, 50 cents; ink stands, 50 cents.

### 1852

The Grand Chapter donated a seal and plate for diplomas for the use of the Masonic College. The Grand Chapter officers were authorized to renew the dispensation of Columbia, Savannah, and Cass County Chapters, if expedient. A resolution was adopted prohibiting the Grand High Priest, or his Deputy, from embodying the Royal and Select degrees in dispensations thereafter granted. All charters granting authority over the Royal and Select degrees were recalled.

The Mitchell case appeared in the nature of a committee report. The Grand Chapter had held Mitchell's note, which he had been unable to pay, except at the sacrifice of his Masonic Publication; the committee recommended a further indulgence.

### 1853

Dispensation was granted to Monticello Chapter; charters were granted to Savannah, Columbia, and Davenport-Frontier Chapters. These three Chapters, during the year, had exalted as many members as all of the other Chapters combined, which prompted M.E. Companion Melody to say:

"Your committee observes with regret the rapidity with which Royal Arch Masons are manufactured by several Chapters under this jurisdiction, more especially by the younger ones. In their zeal to acquire members, all other considerations are apparently lost sight of. In several instances, forty-eight hours do not elapse until the Master Mason finds himself transformed into a Royal Arch Mason."

The time of the annual meeting was changed to the first Monday in April.

The Foreign Correspondent report contained a resolution expressing the opinion that General Grand Chapter control over the Past Master degree was an infringement upon the prerogatives of Grand Lodges, that High Priests might be installed without having previously received the Order of High Priesthood. A part of the report discussed the expediency of dissolving the General Grand Chapter.

It was decided to enter on the field of education by the organization of a Board of Education who was to supervise the education of orphan children in the Masonic College at Lexington. The experiment was begun with two orphan boys.

The note of George H.C. Melody, which was at first \$200.00, but which had rapidly increased to \$450.00, was donated to him in payment for a large portion of his time spent in advancing the interest of the Order.

### 1854

Grand High Priest Grimsley gave dispensations for Chapters at Platte City, Jefferson City, and Bloomington. A Committee on the address of the Grand High Priest appears in this year. The Annual Convocation had been fixed for April 5<sup>th</sup>, 1854, but for good and sufficient reasons, the principal one being to secure the meetings of two Grand Bodies at the same period with a consequent larger representation, the Grand High Priest convened the Grand Chapter on the date fixed, but adjourning it until May 17<sup>th</sup>, 1854. A charter was granted to Monticello Chapter, U.D.

Resolutions were adopted, making it necessary for all candidates to stand a satisfactory examination. It was decided to elect annually a Grand Lecturer; he was to receive \$200.00. Charters were granted to Jefferson City, Bloomington, and Melody Chapters. Each subordinate Chapter was ordered to assess and collect one additional dollar on each exaltation fee for the use and benefit of its Masonic charges in the College at Lexington.

During this Convocation, occurred the first Convention of High Priests and their minutes are included in the proceedings. Melody presided and O'Sullivan acted as Secretary.

### 1855

Dispensation was granted to George Washington Chapter at Carrollton. The Grand Secretary was instructed to receive no monies "except gold, silver, or Missouri paper." The Grand Master of the Grand Lodge, in behalf of the Grand Lodge, asked for a temporary loan of any funds the Grand Chapter might have on hand at the close of their Convocation. The Committee expressed the opinion that there would be no funds available than were necessary to defray the current and necessary expense of the Grand Chapter.

The notes of Companions Melody and Mitchell were cancelled and donated, the Grand Chapter evidently tiring of discussing them from year to year.

### 1856

The Grand High Priest, Thomas S. Miller, was unable to be present at the Annual Convocation; his deputy supplemented his address with one of his own. O'Sullivan recommended the placing of greater restrictions upon the granting of dispensations for new Chapters; he expressed the opinion that there were a sufficient number of Chapters for all essential purposes and that all who should thereafter apply be required to give ample proof of their Masonic knowledge and satisfy the Grand Chapter as to their paraphernalia and hall requirements.

Charters were granted to George Washington, Bellefontaine, and Bond Chapters. A resolution was adopted requiring every petitioner to be vouched for by three Companions and a statement that the petitioner had made suitable proficiency in all the proceeding degrees. Resolutions on the death of Joseph Megguier were adopted.

### 1857

The Grand High Priest, J. W. Chenoweth, expressed his conviction that where buildings were erected for Chapter use, their formal dedication would be attended with pleasant and good results, and recommended inauguration of the custom of dedication of halls for Chapter purposes.

Companion Melody, who had returned from the General Grand Chapter, presented a piece of the celebrated Charter Oak, which was to be made into a gavel for use at Annual Convocations.

### 1858

Grand High Priest DeHaven granted a dispensation to Lone Star Chapter at Chillicothe, and DeMolay Chapter at Warrensburg. Columbia Chapter had been moved to Rocheport and the Grand High Priest reported having visited them and restored their charter.

John F. Houston was responsible for a resolution requiring all Chapters to use a square apron of lambskin, trimmed with scarlet, with a triangular flap upon which was a square enclosing a triangle, and within the triangle a triple Tau.

The charter of Fayette Chapter having been arrested, M.E. Companion Melody was instructed to visit Fayette, collecting such furniture as might be found belonging to the

Chapter. He reported that he had performed that duty and had recovered one ark, one keystone, and three squares, the expense involved in this discovery being \$5.00.

Charters were granted to Mexico and DeMolay Chapters; dispensation of Lone Star Chapter was continued.

### 1859

Grand High Priest Boyd reported the issuance of dispensations for Chapters at Memphis and Kansas City. Charters were granted to Eastern Star Chapter at Memphis, Lone Star Chapter at Chillicothe, and Kansas City Chapter at Kansas City.

Delegates to the General Grand Chapter were instructed to use their influence to bring about its dissolution.

### 1860

Boyd, who had been reelected, did not appear at the 1860 Convocation, but submitted his address. He had granted a dispensation for a Chapter at Greenfield.

A committee was appointed to revise the laws.

Companions at Independence, because of the California emigration, the Kansas excitement, and a destructive fire, asked the restoration of their charter. The \$1.00 additional exaltation fee was repealed. A charter was granted to Greenfield Chapter.

### Resume

We have seen the problems which confronted the Grand Chapter at its organization and we have studied year-by-year problems which confronted the welfare of the fraternity. The first published statistics were those of 1852, which showed the exaltation of 52 candidates, the admission of 4, dimission of 3, and the suspension of 1, a total membership of 271. Comparing these figures with those given for the year ending May  $23^{\rm rd}$ , 1860, 128 exaltations, 29 admissions, 39 dimissions, 34 suspensions, 2 expulsions, 9 deaths, a membership of 882, almost four times as many as reported eight years previous. Every Chapter, except two, had reported exaltations. Of the 31 Chapters which had been chartered, 25 made report on May  $23^{\rm rd}$ , 1860.

The Chapters, which had been chartered during this period, were Missouri No. 1, Palmyra No. 2, Liberty No. 3, Weston No. 4, Boonville No. 5, Fayette No. 6, Hannibal No. 7, St. Louis No. 8, Brunswick No. 9, Lexington No. 10, Jefferson No. 11, Independence No. 12, Huntsville No. 13, St. Joseph No. 14, Springfield No. 15, Monroe (Paris) No. 16, Columbia (first at Columbia, later at Rocheport) No. 17, Savannah No. 18, Davenport-Frontier (Westport) No. 19, Monticello No. 20, Melody (Platte City) No. 21, Bloomington No. 22, Bond (Louisiana) No. 23, George Washington (Carrollton) No. 24, Bellefontaine (St. Louis) No. 25, DeMolay (Warrensburg) No. 26, Mexico No. 27, Kansas City No. 28, Eastern Star (Memphis) No. 29, Lone Star (Chillicothe) No. 30 and Greenfield No. 31.

And, thus the Grand Chapter found itself at the outbreak of the war with twenty-five active Chapters scattered throughout the various parts of the State and a membership of 882. But two of the Chapters were situated in Southern Missouri, the Chapter at Springfield and the one at Greenfield. The majority of the Chapters were north of the river and were to be little affected by the Civil War.

### Biographical

#### RICHARD JOHN HOLMES

Grand Master of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of the State of Missouri 2002-2003

Richard John Holmes was born on October 10, 1937 in St. Louis, Missouri, the only child of Edna and Elmer Holmes. He was educated in the St. Louis public school system and graduated from Hadley Technical High School in January 1956 from the radio and television servicing class. He attended one semester at Missouri School of Mines at Rolla. In February of 1957, he was employed by McDonnell Aircraft Corporation from which he retired in 1993 after 36 plus years as an Electrical and Electronic Mechanic on the flight line. #### ADDRESS OF THE GRAND MASTER

To the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of the State of Missouri:

Good Morning! I want to welcome all to the 138<sup>th</sup> Annual Assembly of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of the State of Missouri. It is my pleasure to extend a hearty welcome to the representatives of the General Grand Council and our out of state visitors. You honor us by your presence, and we deeply appreciate it. We hope that your visit will be a pleasurable one and if there is anything we can do to accommodate you and your Lady, feel free to let us know. When you return to your home states, please take with you our best wishes, and our thanks.

To the Companions of the constituent Councils, thank you for taking time out of your busy schedules to attend your Grand Council session. You are the Grand Council.

My theme for this year has been Membership, Membership, Membership. I, like my counterparts in the Grand Chapter and the Grand Commandery, are thoroughly convinced that all of the problems we are having in our Chapters, Councils, and Commanderies stem from the continuing loss of membership that we have experienced in the past years. The only place that we can go to help stop this erosion of membership and to replace ourselves is our Symbolic Lodges. Only about 10 to 12 percent of the Master Masons in Missouri belong to the York Rite. Somewhere along the line we have failed to get our message across. That is why, in my visits throughout the State, I have encouraged the York Rite bodies to form teams of Companions to visit the Symbolic Lodges in their areas and try to enlighten the Brothers on the benefits, continued Masonic education and fellowship, that the York Rite has to offer.

To this end, we have made available, free of charge except postage, and in any quantity needed, through the Grand Recorders office, two very good pamphlets that explain the York Rite. He also has information on our Charities. These are important tools for us to use to get our message across. I want to commend the membership committee on the efforts they have made this year. I also want to thank the Companions of the Bonne Terre York Rite bodies who went that extra mile and purchased and installed plastic holders for our pamphlets in every Symbolic Lodge in their area. It is efforts like this that will help stem the tide.

I want to thank all the Companions for allowing me to serve them as their Grand Master this past year. The best part of the experience was the fine people my wife and I have met throughout the state. We thank you for sharing with us your fellowship, fun, and good food. We have made many new friends and we will never forget you.

The full record of my travels and visits will be printed in the proceedings, but I would like to mention a few of the highlights.

It was my pleasure to attend the Grand Sessions of all three youth groups in Missouri and present each with a check for \$600.00 from the Charity endowment fund. It was my privilege to participate with the Grand Lodge, Grand High Priest, and the Grand Commander in the dedication of two Cornerstones, one in Fayette, Mo., and one in Columbia, Mo.

I was able to meet with Companions of all 32 Councils in Missouri, either through official visits, joint visits or regional conferences. I found that the Councils in Missouri were having the same problems that many of the fraternal organizations and even our Churches are having throughout the Country, poor attendance, and lack of people wanting to do the necessary work. Some Councils are doing fine with good attendance and good ritual; I commend these Councils. Some are really struggling to survive but

they have a few dedicated Companions who are working to keep these Councils alive, and I commend these Companions too. I feel we owe it to all of them to help them to bring these Councils back.

It was my pleasure to install the Officers of Jasper Council No. 30, Hiram Council No. 1, Centralia Council No. 34, and York Council No. 40. It was my pleasure to present 25 and 50-year veteran service pins at Ezra Council No. 32 and Centralia Council No. 34. I attended the Southwest Conference in Wichita, Kansas, the Triennial session of the General Grand Council in Atlantic City, New Jersey, and I attended the Grand Council sessions in the following states: Illinois, Iowa, Louisiana, Arkansas, Kansas, and Oklahoma.

I have many Companions to thank and we would be here all day if I took the time. But there are a few I would like to mention. First of all I want to thank Most Ill. Companion James H. Cockerham who first appointed me a Regional Deputy Grand Master in Region 5 in 1990. This started my 5 years as R.D.G.M. #### REPORT OF GRAND TREASURER

April 1, 2002 through March 31, 2003

COMPANIONS: All funds are invested in banking institutions in Jefferson City. All accounts are interest bearing, with no service charges, and with amounts being maintained at less than \$100,000 in any one banking institution. Based on previous ledgers, general fund receipts and expenditures are being projected on a monthly basis, so as to keep investments at the highest practical level for the longest practical time frame.

I present herewith my report of the receipts, disbursements, and the financial condition of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of the State of Missouri for the fiscal year, April 1, 2002 through March 31, 2003.

#### REPORTS OF GRAND RECORDER

#### **SUMMARY**

To the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of the State of Missouri:

Companions, we are not there yet but things are beginning to shape up. Joyce has been working with each Council trying to clean up the membership records—it is a big job and we appreciate your help. In mid to late summer we will be moving the membership database into the new database software program developed for the Grand York Rite. From this new database, we will be able to have a much better handle on all forms of membership and recognition programs. We hope to be able to generate veteran membership certificates without your request based on due dates; help Councils keep track of their membership; and start working on preprinted annual returns.

At the time of this communication, we are still waiting only one annual return from El Camino No. 52.

Nine annual reports were late this year, the last being received on April 30th. Companions, it is all but impossible for the office to be able to complete necessary tasks and provide membership information if the returns are not on time.

Ten Councils report that their Treasurer and Recorder are bonded. Several Councils have reported that the funds of the Council are NOT deposited into an account with at least two signatures. Illustrious Masters and officers are reminded that this needs to be rectified as soon as possible.

The following Councils either failed to perform an annual audit, the audit was incomplete, or the seal of the Council was not affixed: St. Joseph No. 9, Cape No. 20, Shekinah No. 24, Zabud No. 25, Chillicothe No. 28, Jasper No. 30, Westport No. 38, Rolla No. 39, Kirksville No. 44, Independence No. 49, El Camino No. 52, Harmony No. 53, and Lebanon No. 56. Although an annual audit is not mandatory in accordance with Grand Council law, an audit serves the best interest of the Council and its officers. The seal affixed to the bottom of the annual audit is certification that the Council is in charge of its seal.

It is very difficult to express how unfortunate it is to receive and review some of the annual returns: Recorders choose not to complete all the information, the information provided is sometimes grossly incorrect, mathematical computations are in error, audits are either barely touched or not at all, and much information is simply missing. These deficient returns will be audited, subjected to known corrections, and returned to the Councils for follow-up action. Officers are reminded that they should take more time and care in the completion of their returns.

Greeting Certificates: The Grand Master has determined that the office will issue Greeting Certificates for all new candidates at no charge provided that the Recorders make the request and get the information in to the Grand Recorder. We have agreed that this is the least we can do to acknowledge our new members and the cost is minimal.

Council Activity reports were developed in 2001 in order to provide up to date information on membership statewide. To those that are keeping up with these reports, we

thank you. However, many Councils do not submit the reports and it has been suggested that Recorders do not have to do this at all. Please do not put us in a position to propose a change in the law to make the submission of the report mandatory. I assure you, the report is necessary for the evolution of annual returns, for us to be able to track demits and suspensions, to keep track of current officers for proper mailings, and to help Secretaries and Recorders keep track of their membership. Chapter Secretaries and Council and Commandery Recorders do not communicate with each other very well when it comes to tracking their membership. It would be almost impossible for them to do this; it therefore falls onto this office. We require the information in order to be able to preprint the annual returns—all of this will make the Recorder's job much easier in the long run. This is where we are headed and we need your help to make it happen.

The format of the 2002 proceedings was modified to provide for a document which is more organized and easier to navigate. There were more pictures included which made for a larger document and this is not without cost. The Grand Council should determine, in its wisdom, if this is necessary or worthwhile. I would suggest, for historical reasons, it is. As the cost of printing the proceedings will increase somewhat from year to year, it might be suggested to charge the Order of the Silver Trowel and other bodies for a share of the expenses equal to their coverage in the document. Estimated costs would run about \$20.00 per page. Although this amount is not all that significant, it could save the bodies some money.

In the new proceedings, we have removed the address and personal information from each of the multiple listings of individuals normally found throughout the document and moved them to the end of the book in a directory. We feel this is much easier for the writing of the document and provides for a user-friendly reference section in the back of the book.

We have moved the printing of the document to Columbia where we can work hand in hand with the printer in resolving any issues which may arise. We are now using the same printer used by the Grand Lodge for their proceedings.

Joyce and I thank the Grand Master and all the Grand Council officers for a most enjoyable and productive year. It has been a pleasure to work with MIC Holmes and all of the officers. We would also thank the officers and members of the Councils for working with us as we try to move onward and upward. We look forward to working with all of you in the future.

The foregoing Report relates to actions taken by the Grand Master to and including April 10, 2003. No other matters have been brought to the attention of the Committee to and including April 10, 2003.

#### Motion Approved, May 15, 2003.

Companions, the Jurisprudence Committee has further examined actions of the Grand Master since March 31, 2003 including orders and actions on requests from local Councils. The Committee has also reviewed the Report of the Grand Master and it is the view of the Jurisprudence Committee that those actions of the Grand Master were within his power and authority and therefore, the Jurisprudence Committee approves those matters.

#### Proposed Legislation Laid Over from 2002

Proposed Amendment to ARTICLE III, Sec. 17, Subsection (4)

To the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of the State of Missouri:

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Article III, Sec. 17, Subsection (4), The Committee on Finance and Accounts, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of the State of Missouri, be Amended as follows:

By adding to the first paragraph: "The fiscal year of the Grand Council shall end May 31st of each year."

#### This Section of the By-Laws currently reads:

"Shall examine the financial statements of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder together with the report of the Auditor and report upon the same. It shall also report upon all matters touching the finances of the Grand Council and no appropriation shall be made without having been considered and reported upon by this committee."

#### If Adopted, this Section would read:

It shall also report upon all matters touching the finances of the Grand Council and no appropriation shall be made without having been considered and reported upon by this committee. The fiscal year of the Grand Council shall end May 31<sup>st</sup> of each year."

#### **Statement of Purpose:**

According to Article III, Sec. 17, Subsection (4), The Committee on Finance and Accounts, "It shall also report upon all matters touching the finances of the Grand Council and no appropriation shall be made without having been considered and reported upon by this committee."

In accordance with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Grand Council, it is inappropriate for the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder to continue paying the expenses of the Grand Council.

It is therefore necessary to set the fiscal year of the Grand Council to include the expenses currently involved in operating the Grand Council from April 1<sup>st</sup> through and including the Annual Assembly. By moving to May 31<sup>st</sup>, all fiscal obligations for the Grand Council year will be the responsibility of the same core of officers and committeemen.

# Proposed Legislation to Lay Over to 2004

# Proposed Amendment to Article XVI, Life Membership

To the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of the State of Missouri:

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Article XVI, Life Membership, Section 135, of the by-laws of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of the State of Missouri, be amended as follows:

1. By striking paragraph 2 and inserting a new paragraph.

Paragraph 2 currently states: Any member may purchase a life membership using the following method of computing the fee. Divide his council dues by 5% which will be

the cost of a life membership if purchased between January 1 and June 30, if purchased after June 30, add one year's dues.

New paragraph 2 would state: Any member may purchase a life membership by computing the fee as 20 times the member's Council dues at time of purchase of said life membership, provided that no life membership fee shall be less than \$300.00.

2. By striking paragraph 12 and inserting a new paragraph.

Paragraph 12 currently states: The Grand Recorder shall annually remit to the recorders of participating constituent Councils their prorated portion of the earnings of the Life Membership Fund. The per capita tax charged to a Council on one of its member's participation in the Life Membership Program shall be that as existed at the time the individual entered the Life Membership Program. It will be the responsibility of the Constituent Council to pay the per capita tax for each Life Member. When a Life Member dies, his council will continue to receive his prorated earnings, less 10% which will be added to the Funds principal to provide for growth in the Fund.

New paragraph 12 would state: The Grand Recorder shall annually remit to the recorders of participating constituent Councils their prorated portion of the earnings of the Life Membership Fund minus per capita. This is provided that no earnings shall be distributed on any Life Membership until January 1 of the second (2nd) calendar year after such fee, paid in full, is deposited with the Grand Recorder. When a Life Member dies, the Grand Council will continue to receive his per capita, less 20% and his council will continue to receive his prorated earnings, less 20%. The retained 20% will be added to the Funds principal to provide for growth in the Fund. Prorated earnings shall be based on the members' council dues that existed at the time the individual entered the Life Membership Program. Per capita shall be the per capita that existed at the time the individual entered the Life Membership Program.

3. By deleting paragraph 15 in its entirety.

Paragraph 15 currently states: The Governing Body of the Life Membership Program shall be empowered to establish a minimum fee for life membership. However, no minimum fee shall be less then \$125.00. The fees shall be reviewed annually by the governing body of the Life Membership Program and a report made to the Annual Assembly. If found necessary to change the fee, it will be proposed in writing and submitted in accordance with Article XV: Amendments.

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** It is our understanding that the purpose of having a member pay an additional year's dues, who purchased a Life Membership after June 30, was due to the fact that the Grand Council could not generate a return on that Life Membership in less than six months time. Therefore, the additional year's dues should not have been part of the endowment, but used as a part of the earnings for distribution for that year. However, due to the wording of the existing by-law, the additional year's dues were deposited as part of the principal of the fund. This has not been all bad as it

has allowed the fund to grow, but in turn has caused unnecessary paperwork, confusion and concern with many Recorders of the constituent Councils.

Currently, the fund must achieve annual earnings in excess of 5%, in order to provide for a 100% distribution. By establishing a minimum of one (1) year for the earnings from any new Life Membership investment (participant), it allows that investment to have earnings for at least a full year.

The principal of the fund must grow, in order to provide for greater earnings. The return of 20% of a deceased members earnings to the principal of the fund will allow the fund to grow, without greatly hampering the Grand Council and constituent Councils.

It is not in the best interest of the Council Recorders and the Grand Recorder's office to require Councils to pay per capita on their Life Members and then receive a return from the Grand Council of that per capita. The Grand Council can simply transfer its share (per capita on Life Members) to the General Fund and return the remainder of the earnings of that fund to the Councils, saving much time in the transfer of paperwork and money. Stated simply, the Councils should not be required to pay per capita on their Life Members; that is the designated purpose of the Life Membership Fund from a Grand Council perspective.

The necessary items in paragraph 15 are adequately covered elsewhere in this section and need not be duplicated.

By establishing an increased minimum participation fee, doing away with the additional year's dues, and eliminating unnecessary paperwork, the fund can grow, be less confusing for the Councils, and ease the management of the fund by the Grand Council.

Vincent Kinkead, Chairman Under the discussion phase of this process, the chairman addressed the grand assembly by directing their attention to the report of the Grand Recorder in the preliminary proceedings with regards to the cost of printing the proceedings and the content therein. The question was called for and approved by vote of the assembly.

# Proposed Budget "B" Passed, May 15, 2003.

The Chairman of the Finance Committee again addressed the grand assembly with regards to the Miscellaneous budget item above. It was addressed by the Finance Committee during their meeting to provide for \$800.00 in this section of the budget to supplement Life Membership returns to Councils due to the lack of income in the returns on investments of the Life Membership funds. It was expressed by the chairman that he was not in agreement with this decision and that the committee was not in total agreement. It was also expressed that if the Life Membership returns were not enough to fully return dues to the Councils, that the returns be subject to the losses in the fund, but that he was not in favor of all members paying per capita to share the burden of fully funding Life Membership returns.

With regards to the comments by the Chairman of the Finance Committee, the Grand Master brought back before the grand assembly the content and format of the proceedings. Various discussion from the floor suggested that the craft approved of the current format. It was moved by the Grand Recorder and seconded to keep the pictures and current format and that future proceedings be printed and distributed as usual to the Councils and Grand Officers, but those proceedings to be distributed to other jurisdictions and to those that request it, be distributed on CD to help reduce the cost of the printing.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON AUDIT

To the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of the State of Missouri:

Companions: Your Audit Committee for the Fiscal Year of 2002-2003 report as follows:

#### Observations:

- 1. In examining the financial records provided by the Grand Recorder it was noted that expenses exceed income by \$6,077.92.
- 2. In comparing actual expense to the budget from the records provided by the Grand Recorder it was noted that income was less than budget by \$4,288.25 and that expenses were more than budget by \$5.879.67.
- 3. It appeared that perhaps some expenses from prior fiscal years were paid in the current fiscal year while some income for the current fiscal year was recorded in the prior fiscal year.
- 4. From the financial records provided by the Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer, it was noted that the Grand Treasurer reported \$17,863.70 more expenses than the Grand Recorder.
- 5. Also from the financial records provided by the Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer, it was noted that the Grand Treasurer reported \$14,327.70 more expenses than the Grand Recorder.
- 6. The audit committee did not receive photocopies of Bank Statements requested from the Grand Treasurer in a timely manner and thus were not used when this report was prepared. <sup>1</sup>
- The audit committee did not receive photocopy of the IRS Form 990 for the Fiscal Year of 2001-2002 that was requested from the Grand Treasurer and/or the Grand Recorder.

#### Recommendations:

- 1. There is a need for improved coordination of accounting practices and procedures between the Grand Treasurer and the Grand Recorder.
- Any differences between the financial reports of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder should be reconciled with proper explanations provided as to the differences.
- 3. A professional CPA or Auditor should be employed to conduct future audits.

# Biographical

He graduated from Murray State University, in Murray, Kentucky in 1969 with a BA in History and Political Science and after graduation, he taught school for a year before enlisting in the Army Reserve. He was given a medical discharge from the Army after serving a few months and moved to Kansas City, Missouri, where he worked for the Missouri Correction System as a Juvenile Placement Officer and a Group Home Manager. He met his wife Debbie and they had two girls, Jennifer and Patricia. Bill has three grandchildren, William Bryant Wimmer, Spencer Joseph Wimmer and Nicole Wimmer. He and his wife are members of Trinity Presbyterian Church, in Independence Missouri. Bill has been the sales manager of Thrifty Nickel Want Ads of Kansas City for the past 20 years.

Bill was initiated Entered Apprentice July 9, 1968, pasted to the degree of Fellowcraft August 13, 1968, and raised to the Degree of Master Mason, September 10, 1968 in Cooper Lodge No. 36 in Boonville, Missouri. He was exalted a Royal Arch Mason on April 3, 1969 in Murray Chapter No. 92, Murray, Kentucky. On May 10, 1969 he was greeted a Select Master in Murray Council No. 50, Murray, Kentucky and was knighted in Mayfield Commandery No. 49, Mayfield, Kentucky the same day. Bill currently belongs to Temple Gate Lodge No. 299 and has dual membership to Independence Lodge No. 76. He served as Master of Rural Lodge No. 316 (Now Temple Gate 299) in 1985.

His theme this year is Share the Light. He is encouraging all York Rite Masons to Share the Light with their brethren because it will surely increase membership and support for the Commandery.

#### MEMORIAL SERVICE

I cannot believe that any one who has attended a Necrology ceremony by Jobs' Daughters or the Order of the True Kindred came away with dry eyes.

This is not to be such a report. On at least one occasion Jesus said not to take time to bury the dead. It is interesting how many ways different cultures dispose of their mortal remains. It is also interesting to observe how many different ways those who have departed this life are remembered.

Very soon, many of us will go to the cemeteries to decorate the graves of our departed loved ones. My Mother-in-Law referred to it as "that Pagan Thing." My wife and I go to several different ones. Interestingly my Mother-in-Law wanted to be buried along with her Husband close to Kansas City so that it would be easy for my Wife and I to decorate (not forget) their graves. A friend from Detroit told me that he did not know of Decoration Day before moving to Kansas City.

Watching the History Channel the other evening I discovered that not only did the Egyptians mummify their dead but that the Mayans did also. It was very interesting how the Mayans accomplished that in their very humid jungle environment.

How we honor those departed loved ones is at least as interesting as how we dispose of their remains. One of the most beautiful buildings in the world was built in India by a husband as a memorial to his wife. This is in a country where they put the dead husband on a huge pyre, put his live wife beside him and set it on fire. In America, we build monuments to honor, name streets to honor, and erect gravestones in the shape of tree trunks to mark the graves of our loved ones. Walk through cemeteries and you will find any number of graves with the Square and Compass carved on head stones.

Perhaps this will help you to better understand how others honor their dead and reflect on how you choose to honor those people who have had an impact on your life. How will you be remembered? Are you leaving footprints in the sand?

In June, I attended the Jobs Daughters Grand Bethel in Jefferson City and had the honor of presenting the Grand Commanders Youth Award for Outstanding Job's Daughter to Diane Lynch of Bethel No. 50. They were used to dispense valuable information for the craft as well as to let the incoming Presiding Grand York Rite Officers for 2003-2004 present their program for next year and get it to the craft early. With some fine-tuning, the conferences should and will continue to be a valuable aid to both the Officers and Members of the Grand York Rite Bodies. Again, I wish to thank the Grand Commandery Officers for their overwhelming support and attendance at these conferences.

#### **CHARITY**

As with all Masonic Organizations, one of our primary reasons for existing as Knights Templar is Charity. We need to continue to support our three philanthropies. The Knight Templar Eye Foundation, Holy Land Pilgrimage, Holy Land Pilgrimage Endowment Fund, and we should not forget the Knights Templar Education Foundation. I find that many of our members, although aware of these philanthropies are not as aware as they should be of how to help someone get assistance from one of them. As officers, this is our fault and we need to make our members more aware of the details.

#### CONDITION OF THE ORDER

The condition of the order is not good; many of our Constituent Commanderies cannot do the work. We are loosing approximately nine percent of our members per year; you do not need to be much of a mathematician to see where that will lead. If we cannot do the work, where will the new members come from? We are close to the point where entire Regions cannot confer the orders. Many of our Commanderies also are dangerously close to a point where they will be unable to field a quorum a sufficient number of times during the year to comply with our bylaws. We must address these problems and do what we can do to recognize and correct them.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

First and foremost, we must address the woeful condition of the work in each region. It is my recommendation that we form regional ritual teams and that the orders be conferred in each region on a quarterly basis. If we have no candidates, we can certainly use the practice and if it is scheduled maybe our members will renew their interest in inviting our brothers in the Symbolic Lodges to receive more light by becoming members of the York Rite. Most Excellent Companion Roy Welshon and Most Illustrious Companion Richard Holmes and I have done away with charges for petitions, membership certificates, and educational materials as well as instructing the Grand Recorder to place electronic, printable copies of most of the forms used in the York Rite on the web site for the use of the membership (these are printable). I recommend that this practice be continued. There has also been an interest in at large drill teams expressed by a number of Sir Knights that are currently unable to drill in our annual drill competition; it seems to me that anything that increases interest is to the benefit of the Grand Commandery so I recommend that we explore the possibility of doing this also. It is apparent as you visit the various Commanderies throughout the state that if a Commandery participates in the Drill, they seem more likely to consistently have a quorum at their meetings. Therefore, I feel that it is important to encourage this activity also. I would also like the Grand Commandery to amend the tactics for opening a Commandery to include the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag with the words "Under God." Finally, some of our Commanderies do not seem to feel that it is necessary to file their annual reports or pay their dues in a timely manner; therefore, I unfortunately recommend that we investigate revoking voting rights and privileges for any Commandery that is still in arrears at the Grand Commandery Conclave.

#### CONCLUSION

Each of the monthly Grand Commander's Messages in the Knights Templar Magazine this year ended with two statements; one from my predecessor, Past Grand Commander Bob Hudson, Every Christian Mason should be a Knights Templar, and Share the Light. Each of you must have been sufficiently impressed and proud of your membership to remain a member at some time so why wouldn't you think that your friends would not be also. If you are not proud enough of the organization to share the light with them why should they knock down our doors, we have to let them know what they are missing. Our loss of membership is becoming critical and there are very few problems that the Commandery has that cannot be solved if we successfully address the membership problem. In a way, we are lucky because we can focus on one single thing to cure most of our ills. Very few organizations can do this.

I wish to thank Sir Knight Orville Newberry for agreeing to serve as Eminent Grand Sentinel and for his support and availability as a traveling companion and driver as well as sounding board this year.

#### REPORTS OF GRAND RECORDER

#### SUMMARY

To the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Missouri:

Sir Knights, we are not there yet but things are beginning to shape up. Joyce has been working with each Commandery trying to clean up the membership records—it is a big job and we appreciate your help. In mid to late summer we will be moving the membership database into the new database software program developed for the Grand York Rite. From this new database, we will be able to have a much better handle on all forms of membership and recognition programs. We hope to be able to generate veteran membership certificates without your request based on due dates; help Commanderies keep track of their membership; and start working on preprinted annual returns.

At the time of this communication, we are still waiting on annual returns from Cour de Leon No. 14, Boanerges No. 34, and Maryville No. 40. Cour de Leon No. 14 has not filed an annual return for 2000 or 2001; Boanerges No. 34 has not filed an annual return for 2001; and Maryville No. 40 has not filed an annual return for 2001. The office understands that there are new Recorders, but would strongly suggest the Commanderies who have not filed an annual report for 2000 or 2001 be put on notice.

Fourteen annual reports were late this year, the last being received on April 30<sup>th</sup>. Sir Knights, it is all but impossible for the office to be able to complete necessary tasks and provide membership information if the returns are not on time.

Thirteen Commanderies report that their Treasurer and Recorder are bonded. Several Commanderies have reported that the funds of the Commandery are NOT deposited into an account with at least two signatures. Commanders and officers are reminded that this needs to be rectified as soon as possible.

The following Commanderies either failed to perform an annual audit, the audit was incomplete, or the seal of the Commandery was not affixed: Hugh de Paynes No. 4, Palestine No. 17, St. John's No. 20, Ely No. 22, Tancred No. 25, Constantine No. 27, Calvary No. 28, Paschal No. 32, Oriental No. 35, Ascension No. 39, Maryville No. 40, Bethany No. 42, Cape Girardeau No. 55, DeSoto No. 56, Rolla No. 59, St. Amand No. 64, and Westport No. 68. In accordance with Grand Commandery law, Article VI, Section 118, said audit is mandatory. Were this law not in existence, many Commanderies would never perform an audit. The seal affixed to the bottom of the annual audit is certification that the Commandery is in charge of its seal.

It is very difficult to express how unfortunate it is to receive and review some of the annual returns: Recorders choose not to complete all the information, the information provided is sometimes grossly incorrect, mathematical computations are in error, audits are either barely touched or not at all and much information is simply missing. These deficient returns will be audited, subjected to known corrections, and returned to the Commanderies for follow-up action. Officers are reminded that they should take more time and care in the completion of their returns.

Knighting Certificates: The Grand Commander has determined that the office will issue Knighting Certificates for all new candidates at no charge provided that the Recorders make the request and get the information in to the Grand Recorder. We have agreed that this is the least we can do to acknowledge our new members and the cost is minimal.

Commandery Monthly Reports: 11 Commanderies failed to submit any form of a monthly report in the last 11 months. They are: Excalibar No. 5, Coeur de Leon No. 14, Constantine No. 27, Calvary No. 28, Jasper No. 31, Paschal No. 32, Boanerges No. 34, Ascension No. 39, Maryville No. 40, Mountain Grove No. 66, and Westport No. 68. We understand the Westport Recorder was changed this year and he has had major illnesses.

In addition to those listed above, the following Commanderies failed to submit the absolute minimum of 4 monthly reports (and on time): Kansas City No. 10, O'Sullivan No. 15, Godfrey de Bouillon No. 24, Neosho No. 57, Harve de Grace No. 63, St. Amand No. 64, Malta No. 72.

Finally, the following Commanderies completed all monthly reports on time: DeMolay No. 3, Ivanhoe No. 8, St. Omar No. 11, St. Graal No. 12, Ely No. 22, Prince of Peace No. 29, and Navarre No. 45. To these Recorders, I salute you!

A complete listing of the status of monthly reports will be included in the reports of the Grand Recorder. Concerning the reports, we can assure you the reports are mandatory and necessary for the evolution of annual returns, for us to be able to track dimits and suspensions, to keep track of current officers for proper mailings, and to help Secretaries and Recorders keep track of their membership. Chapter Secretaries and Council and Commandery Recorders do not communicate with each other very well when it comes to tracking their membership. It would be almost impossible for them to do this; it therefore falls onto this office. We require the information in order to be able to preprint the annual returns—all of this will make the Recorder's job much easier in the long run. This is where we are headed and we need your help to make it happen.

The format of the 2002 proceedings was modified to provide for a document which is more organized and easier to navigate. There were more pictures included which made for a larger document and this is not without cost. The Grand Commandery should determine, in its wisdom, if this is necessary or worthwhile. I would suggest, for historical reasons, it is. As the cost of printing the proceedings will increase somewhat from year to year, it might be suggested to charge the Missouri Past Commanders' Association and other bodies for a share of the expenses equal to their coverage in the document. Estimated costs would run about \$20.00 per page. Although this amount is not all that significant, it could save the bodies some money.

In the new proceedings, we have removed the address and personal information from each of the multiple listings of individuals normally found throughout the document and moved them to the end of the book in a directory. We feel this is much easier for the writing of the document and provides for a user-friendly reference section in the back of the book.

We have moved the printing of the document to Columbia where we can work hand in hand with the printer in resolving any issues which may arise. We are now using the same printer used by the Grand Lodge for their proceedings.

Joyce and I thank the Grand Commander and all the Grand Commandery officers for a most enjoyable and productive year. It has been a pleasure to work with SK Hall and all of the officers. We would also thank the officers and members of the Commanderies for working with us as we try to move onward and upward. We look forward to working with all of you in the future.

#### SUPPLEMENTAL

#### 2003 Proceedings

The Grand Recorder addressed the Grand Conclave regarding the printing of the proceedings and the costs related thereto. It was agree to keep the pictures and current format. Following discussion, it was moved by the Grand Recorder and seconded that future proceedings be printed and distributed as usual to the Commanderies and Grand Officers, but those proceedings distributed to other jurisdictions and to those that request it, be distributed on CD to help reduce the cost of the printing.

# Proposed Amendment Laid Over from 2002

Proposed Amendment to ARTICLE VI, Sec. 116

To the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Missouri:

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT:** Article VI, Sec. 116, Annual Returns, of the By-Laws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Missouri, be Amended as follows: By replacing the words, "April 20<sup>th</sup>" with "May 31<sup>st</sup>".

**THIS SECTION OF THE BY-LAWS CURRENTLY READS:** "The returns of each Commandery shall be made up to, and including, December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year, on blanks furnished by the Grand Recorder. They shall be forwarded to the Grand Recorder on or before February 1<sup>st</sup> in each year, accompanied by the amount due from said Commandery. The fiscal year of the Grand Commandery shall end April 20<sup>th</sup> of each year, and all accounts shall be closed on that date."

**IF ADOPTED, THIS SECTION WOULD READ:** "The returns of each Commandery shall be made up to, and including, December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year, on blanks furnished by the Grand Recorder. They shall be forwarded to the Grand Recorder on or before February 1<sup>st</sup> in each year, accompanied by the amount due from said Commandery. The fiscal year of the Grand Commandery shall end May 31<sup>st</sup> of each year, and all accounts shall be closed on that date."

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** According to Article III, Sec. 34, Accountability for Funds, "No appropriation shall be continued beyond the current year except by reappropriation" with the exception of the Triennial Fund.

In accordance with the Laws and Regulations of the Grand Commandery, it is inappropriate for the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder to continue paying the expenses of the Grand Commandery.

It is therefore necessary to set the fiscal year of the Grand Commandery to include the expenses currently involved in operating the Grand Commandery from April 21<sup>st</sup> through and including the Annual Conclave. By moving to May 31<sup>st</sup>, all fiscal obligations for the Grand Commandery year will be the responsibility of the same core of officers and committeemen.



# REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RETURNS OF COMMANDERIES

To the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Missouri:

Sir Knights: Your committee on Returns of Commanderies has examined the returns of the 47 Commanderies in this jurisdiction and present the following report:

Coeur de Leon No. 14, Calvary No. 28, Boanerges No. 34, Oriental No. 35, Maryville No. 40 and Westport No. 68 have not filed their returns at the time of making this report and will be assessed penalties by the Grand Recorder when received. Excalibar No. 5, Liberty No. 6, Emmanuel No. 7, Kansas City No. 10, St. Graal No. 12, Ascalon No. 16, Ely No. 22, Godfrey de Bouillon No. 24 and Ascension No. 39 were received late and assessed penalties accordingly. Liberty No. 6 did not pay Late Fee assessment for 2001 or 2002 at this time.

In addition to the current year as listed it was found that Coeur de Leon No. 14 has not made returns for the years 2000 and 2001, Boanerges No. 34 and Maryville No. 49 have not made returns for 2001 and Westport No. 68 did not file 2001 returns until this year.

The reports were neatly prepared although many contained errors, many of which were caused by Recorders evidently no keeping accurate membership records.

The problem of Audit Reports seems to be eliminated since your Grand Recorder has made this report a part of the Annual Returns.

The Monthly Update Report shows no improvement with about 40% of the Recorders not making this report on a regular basis. If this were made regularly, it would help each Recorder keep better membership records, assist the Grand Recorder, and eliminate magazine postage waste.

#### REPORT OF AUDIT COMMITTEE

To the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Missouri:

Greetings: An audit of the financial records and accounting practices of the Grand Commandery was conducted on April 12, 2003. The Committee commends the Grand Recorder, the Grand Recorder's Assistant, and the Grand Treasurer for their assistance, congeniality, and utmost cooperation in this endeavor.

The Committee makes the following finding(s):

Both the Grand Recorder and the Grand Treasurer maintain a dual procedure of checks and balances far surpassed by most in the private sector and, which is way and above that required by the Laws of the Grand Commandery;

The records of the Grand Recorder and the Grand Treasurer are, for the most part, easily readable and self-explanatory to the casual observer. The records of each are impeccably maintained and, neither Officer had any difficulty in providing adequate explanation of entries for the very few questions posed by the Committee;

Both the Grand Recorder and the Grand Treasurer maintain separate files relative to the income and expenditures of the Grand Commandery that are easily identified and traced to documentation depicting both;

The files of the Grand Recorder and the Grand Treasurer are divided according to the identity of the particular fund thereby eliminating any confusion as to which entry belongs under which category;

The two Officers communicate with each other regularly which serves to reduce or eliminate altogether any chance for oversight or error;

The expenditures are continually and regularly coordinated and compared to the budget adopted by the Grand Commandery;

The Committee was particularly impressed with the spreadsheets maintained by the two Officers;

The Committee was even more impressed by the decision to compute income of the Grand Commandery by a projected method of determining membership as opposed to the number left at the end of the Templar year;

The Committee was further impressed by the decision to change the fiscal reporting year to be more in line with the Annual Conclave which more accurately reflects income and expenditures and, gives the Finance Committee a more accurate reflection for the upcoming year;

The Grand Treasurer has an excellent working relationship and understanding with the financial institutions with whom this Grand Commandery has business and,

The Grand Recorder and the Grand Treasurer are bonded in amounts sufficient to cover the duties of their Offices.

The Audit Committee makes the following recommendation(s):

That all Committees or subcommittees having a financial responsibility to the Grand Commandery do so by means of a written report. This recommendation excludes the Golf Committee which has done so since its inception and, continues to provide an excellent review of its income and expenditures; and.

That all monies, funds, etc., collected by these Committees, pass through the Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer prior to their disbursement to the charitable organization they represent. In this day and age of government oversight, this Grand Commandery has to be able to demonstrate that it is indeed a charitable organization in compliance with the Laws of the United States and the State of Missouri, not to mention the Grand Encampment. It is therefore necessary that such a reporting and accounting policy be adopted and practiced by this Grand Commandery.

Examples of such Committees are: Knights Templar Eye Foundation; Holy Land Pilgrimage; and Holy Land Pilgrimage Endowment Funds, to name a few.

The salary of both the Grand Recorder and the Grand Treasurer are woefully low and, nowhere even proximate that of a company in the private sector of comparable size. For all the work and money saving endeavors undertaken by this Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer, it is a slam in the face of both that their salaries and that of the assistants are near or below poverty level.

To close, this Grand Commandery would be loathe to locate persons with the impunity and dedication demonstrated by this Grand Recorder and this Grand Treasurer. This Grand Commandery can rest assured its funds are safe and appropriately applied by our Law.

Right Eminent Grand Commander: The Drill Committee of the Grand Commandery of Missouri has effected some changes over the period of several years; some of welcomed note, and some of disinterested controversy.

Scores in the Asylum Drill Competition have, and continue to show, the high level of interest and competitive spirit of the Constituent Commanderies of Missouri. The Judging Committee, amply chaired by S.K. Jose' Palacios, has made some very observant calls, and some that have not always been received with open arms.

Nonetheless, we all congratulate the Judging Committee for their ability to mark each Commandery with a studied eye, and they have our undying thanks for a job well done; a job that many of us would shy away from.

The current practice of no substitution penalty for Sir Knights in line in the "A" Drill has not fostered any significant increase in Constituent Commandery entries. It was hoped that this would encourage Commanderies with a near complete Drill Team to recruit the needed Sir Knights in line from other ranks. This does not seem to be the answer as the "A" team numbers have remained the same; Ascalon Commandery No. 16 in St. Louis, and Palestine Commandery No. 17 in Independence.

Our "B" team Commanderies are, on the other hand, quite numerous; varying between 8 and 9 over the years, with 2 class "C" teams that will enter this year's competition as a Class "B".

I do anticipate a high level of competition at the 2003 Grand Commandery Session in Jefferson City, and the Drill Committee will submit a supplementary report of the 2003 Asylum Drill Competition to be included in the 2003 Proceedings.

### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON INVESTMENTS

To the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Missouri:

Sir Knights: All Grand Commandery Funds are invested in banking institutions in Jefferson City. All accounts are interest bearing, with no service charges, and with amounts being maintained at less than \$100,000.00 in any one banking institution.

Even though interest rates are at an all time low, reasonable returns have been achieved by a prudent staggered investment policy and a combination of interest bearing checking accounts, money market accounts, and Certificates of Deposit. Based on previous ledgers, general fund receipts and expenditures are being projected on a monthly basis, so as to keep investments at the highest practical level for the longest practical time

frame. The interest bearing checking accounts are maintained at a minimum level, while the majority of the funds are invested in higher yielding money market accounts and CD's.

An effort is underway to invest CD's into a five-year program and thus be able to earn the slightly higher five-year rate of return. However, this program is currently on hold due to the extremely low interest rates, with re-investments now being made on a two to three year basis until longer term rates receive a more favorable rate of return. General Fund CD's are invested so that at least one CD matures each year. Thusly, we have funds available each year in case of a crisis.

Also, prior to CD investments, several Missouri banks are contacted and the highest reasonable rate available at that time is utilized for the investment.

The membership reports I have been receiving from the Grand Encampment have been very disturbing. In May of 2000, Missouri had a membership of 7,305. In April of this year, our membership has declined to 6,230. That is a decrease of 1,075 members in a little less than three years. At this rate of decline, will there even be a Grand Commandery of Missouri in twenty years?

So far this year through February, we have only knighted 82 and 16 affiliated. Thirty-four were reinstated, but twenty-nine demitted. This year through February we have suspended 363 and lost 145 to death. I attended the York Rite Conferences in Springfield, St. Joseph, and St. Louis, reporting facts and trying to motivate membership.

In September, I sent a letter to all Commanderies asking them to make a dedicated effort to contact the newly made Master Masons in their area, and invite them to join the York Rite. So far, our reports have not reflected any increases, only decreases.

I encourage each of you to replace yourself with at least one new Sir Knight. In our St. Louis newspapers I continue to see many Lodges doing degree work, a one-day class took in 58 new members in St. Louis. Maybe we should be attending these classes and putting in a good word for York Rite. The Shrine is present to shake hands and welcome everyone in the morning, what are we as York Rite Masons doing? Please, attend your Blue Lodges, sell York Rite Masonry, and let's get some of our younger people involved to carry Masonry into the next millennium.

### DISTINGUISHED COMMANDERY

SK Baird informed him that he did not want the allowance, some \$3,000.00 for the year. SK Hunt asked again a few months later and again, he was informed it was not wanted or needed. After discussion with friends, he finally agreed to accept it. He determined that he would use it in some way to help the Grand Commandery.

In 1989, when he gave his report to the Grand Commandery, SK Jake told the Sir Knights assembled what had happened. SK Jacob C. Baird and SK Chester H. Hazen, working together, decided to create an award which would be given to a Commandery that had "distinguished" itself, something aside from the Grand Commandery Honor Commandery Award. They would call it simply a "Distinguished Commandery" award. SK Jake used the money to buy a supply of plaques and thus they have been presented since.

Missouri Priory No. 17, KYCH, met on May 15, 2003, at 5:00 PM at the Capitol Plaza Hotel in Jefferson City, Missouri. The Priory was opened in ritualistic form by the following officers:

Eminent Prior – Earl W. Orr Deputy Prior – Jack R. Clark, Sr. Warder – E. Allen Kohler (\*) Registrar/Treasurer – Robert L. Hudson Prelate – Jose' R. Palacios Orator – Roy N. Thomas Herald – William J. Bowser

(\*Pro Tem due to death of Knight Wieland)

It was moved and seconded that the minutes of June 15, 2002, be approved as printed and distributed in the 2002 Proceedings of the Grand York Rite of Missouri. Knight Walter Doyle noted that there was an error in the minutes with regard to the name of the dual member who had been elected. His name should be Robert Anderson. There being no further corrections, the minutes were approved as corrected.

The ballots for proposed members were then distributed. Eminent Prior Orr appointed the following Knights as tellers: Stanton T. Brown, Robert W. Schlichter, and Harold J. Richardson. The ballots were collected and the tellers retired to count the ballots. The Registrar will prepare a list of those proposed, the city in which they live, and the name(s) of the Knight(s) proposing them for membership. Section 9. Membership in Missouri Priory No. 17 shall be by invitation. Proposal forms must be obtained from and returned to the Registrar not later than the date specified in the annual letter mailed to each member near the beginning of each year. The Registrar shall prepare a list of those proposed, the city in which they live, and the name(s) of the Knights(s) proposing them for membership. This list shall be made available to all members attending the May annual conclave. Since the requirements for membership in Missouri Priory No. 17 are higher that most other affiliated Masonic bodies, all proposed members shall be deemed to be elected to membership unless the following occurs: (1) The Priory is advised by a member that Masonic Charges are in the process of being filed against a proposed member. If Masonic Charges are not filed within sixty (60) days of the Priory receiving such notice, the proposed member shall be eligible for consideration at the next May annual meeting provided the Registrar receives a new proposal form. This process may not be repeated for the same proposed member. (2) The Priory is informed by a member that Masonic Charges have been filed against a proposed member. If the Masonic Charges are later dropped or a subsequent Masonic Trial finds that the proposed member is not guilty of the Masonic Charges, then the proposed member shall be eligible for consideration at the next May annual conclave provided the Registrar receives a new proposal form.

After a lengthy discussion, a secret ballot was cast resulting in 33 YES votes and 32 NO votes. The proposed amendment failed, as it did not get a two-thirds majority.

Another amendment to the By-laws, submitted by Knights Harold J. Richardson, James G. Wade, Harold C. Mace, Robert W. Schlichter, Bob L. Detherow, and Foster S. Crawford, was read for the second time as follows:

In Section 5, change the amount from "thirty-five dollars (\$35.00)" to "seventy-five dollars (\$75.00)". If so amended, Section 5 would read as follows:

Section 5. The fee for reception of candidates into this Priory shall be seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) plus the amount collected to be forwarded to the Convent General, payable in full when the proposal is accepted. The fee for Dual membership or for membership by affiliation shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

Following discussion, a secret ballot was cast resulting in 27 YES votes and 20 NO votes. The proposed amendment failed, as it did not get a two-thirds majority.

A letter was read for the second time from a group of twenty-two men who requested permission from our Priory to institute another Priory in Missouri. Following a lengthy discussion, secret ballots were distributed. The ballot resulted in 19 YES votes and 47 NO votes. Therefore, the request was denied.


