ADDRESS OF THE GRAND HIGH PRIEST

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri:

Companions, Ladies, and Distinguished Guests, Good Morning. I welcome you to the 170th Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri. I hope your time at the Grand York Rite Sessions of Missouri is enjoyable and memorable.

I first thank my Lady Karen for being so supportive to me and the Grand Chapter during our time in the advancing line. Without her support and help I would have been more stressed during this journey! She has been my support and Love for over 46 years, without her I would be truly lost.

Next I thank all the Grand Officers for their support this year. Their participation in our many efforts to raise the level of interest in Royal Arch Masonry, participation in events and improvement of ritual state wide have been outstanding. The DDGHP's and DDGL's are also to be commended for their dedication and service to the Grand Chapter.

I also give thanks to M.:.E.:.C.:. Robert W. Schlichter, PGHP, Chair of the Jurisprudence Committee, and his committee members for their help this year. I have asked many questions of them, some of the answers were not what I wanted to hear, however they did keep me and my ideas within the by-laws of the Grand Chapter.

I wish to thank our Grand Secretary, M.:.E.:.C.:. Kevin B. Sample, HPGHP, for his dedication to the Grand Chapter and his advice of wording for some of my correspondence. His council and wisdom were much appreciated by me.

Finally, I give special thanks to my two Grand Aides, V.:.E.:.C.:. Thomas C. Yunick and V.:.E.:.C.:. Richard L. Mansfield, my Grand Sentinel V.:.E.:.C.:. Melvin Hall, and Companion Abdon Navarro for the many hours spent with me traveling this great State. Along with Lady Karen these Companions have traveled with me in excess of 30,000 miles this year visiting local Chapters, visiting with Companions and their Ladies, and enjoying many a good meal prepared for us while visiting their Chapters has been memorable to say the least.

Two events stand out for me this year, the re-dedication of the cornerstone at the Missouri State Capital and the setting to work of a Chapter under dispensation, I will explain.

The Officers of the Grand Chapter of Missouri were invited to participate in the celebration of the Centennial rededication of the Missouri State Capital Cornerstone by the Grand Lodge AF&AM of the State of Missouri. All of the Missouri Masonic Organizations were invited to attend along with the Prince Hall Masonic brethren. What a show of unity. Lady Karen made the comment to me this event made her feel like a "real American". Thinking of the power of that statement, I realized that we all need to feel like Americans in order to express pride in being Americans, and for that matter, Masons. I wonder how many others in attendance felt like American's that day? How many young men were motivated to become Masons?

I had the honor to install the officers of and set to work West Plains Chapter U.D. on May 12, 2016. This Chapter had merged with Mountain Grove approximately nineteen years ago due to lack of participation. A group of young Royal Arch Masons from West Plains decided to reestablish a Chapter there. They contacted MEC Robert W. Schlichter and me for advice as to how to proceed. They were dedicated and provided all requested information in a timely manner. Every officer was present to be installed that night and well supported by their families. I can attest it is unusual for all officers be in attendance for an installation. While in attendance a member asked if I was "Super Dedicated to the Royal Arch" due to having driven five plus hours to install them and set them to work. This dedicated young Royal Arch Mason, Companion Dan Hanley along with others of this Chapter, had just displayed an exemplary proficiency of the ritual in a Chapter degree. He and all those other young dedicated Royal Arch Masons of Missouri give me the inspiration to travel to see them perform our ritual for our candidates. Those candidates received the best degree work there is to offer. I am so proud of all these dedicated Royal Arch Masons and salute them. Their dedication should inspire all of the Grand Officers to give them full support. We should all strive to be "Super Dedicated"!

Hannibal Chapter No. 7 has been struggling for many years. On November 5, 2015, I, MEC Robert W. Schlichter, and several other Grand Line officers met with them to discuss their future. They indicated they wanted to relinquish their Charter. MEC Schlichter explained to them they would have to give their membership a written notice thirty days prior to the meeting to vote to close. A date for this meeting was set for January 7, 2016. On that date several more of Hannibal Chapter No. 7 Companions were in attendance and when a vote was taken to close it was soundly defeated. The Secretary, EC McGregor, was directed by the membership to submit any delinquent annual returns and per capita payments to the Grand Chapter of Missouri as soon as possible. Any and all delinquency fees were waived by me due to the treasury of Hannibal Chapter No. 7 unable to pay them. As of May 14, 2016 they have one new candidate to exalt and two others who will be receive degree work in Columbia on June 13, 2016.

While visiting with the PGHPs who had served prior to 2001, I discovered those MEC's did not receive a PGHP pocket jewel. I had questioned if there was insurance on the GHP jewel I was wearing made in 1874 and valued at over \$15,000.00. Finding it was not insured I decided that this GHP jewel was too valuable to wear and should only be used for Grand Chapter ceremonies. When I requested a quote for a replica of this jewel I discovered we could buy twenty as cheaply as one. The PGHPs prior to 2001 were contacted to see if they would be interested in one at the cost of \$100.00 including engraving their name and their year as GHP on the back. Eleven were sold leaving one for the GHP to wear during his year for the next nine years, preserving the integrity and doing away with the chance the original 1874 GHP jewel being lost.

I wish to give thanks to all the Veterans of the United States Armed forces who have fought or who continue to fight for all the freedoms we have in this great Nation. During the year I was asked by a few Royal Arch Masons if there was a Masonic jewel commemorating their

service to our Country. I looked around on the internet and found none to be had except for the Commandery Bar. I sent an email to the General Grand High Priest, MEC Louis Bartrand, around the first of February 2016 asking if the General Grand Chapter had available a Veteran's Jewel. He thought a jewel was a good idea, but there was not one available presently. He asked if Missouri could design one and send to him the design for the General Grand officers to review. With assistance from Missouri RAMs and John Bridegroom of The Masters Craft, one was designed and sent to MEC Bartrand. In early May 2016, he sent me a request as to where he could get a quote for these Veteran's jewels. He was given the contact information for *The* Masters Craft. On May 21, 2016 I was told by Companion Bridegroom that the General Grand Chapter had requested a quote for two hundred of these jewels. When the Veterans jewels are available and information is up on the General Grand Chapter web page about them I will share that information with you. Just think of the respect a Chapter could show a returning Companion Veteran or to a Veteran of past wars by giving them this jewel as a tribute to their service in protecting our freedoms. Also think of the memories of our fraternity if given to the family of a fallen Companion warrior who had given the ultimate sacrifice for our freedoms, His Life.

On October 17, 2015 the second annual Missouri/Illinois Royal Arch class was held at Freedom Lodge with Keystone Chapter No. 146 RAM hosting and opening the event. Several candidates from Missouri and Illinois were exalted to the Royal Arch. Companions from Illinois conferred the Mark Master and Past Mater Degrees and Missouri Companions conferred the Most Excellent Master and the Royal Arch degrees. The Candidates received excellent degree work and were the first be exalted by Missouri and Illinois Companions in Missouri. The degree teams from both states have my admiration for the work they did for these candidates.

The 5th Annual Grand Master's Royal Arch Class was held at the Columbia Masonic Temple on March 5, 2016. Columbia Chapter No. 17 RAM hosted the event, however for the first time Palmyra Chapter No. 2 RAM opened Chapter for the event. There was also another first at this event, EC and MWB C. Brent Stewart, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge AF&AM of the State of Missouri served as High Priest in opening the Chapter. He did an exemplary job with the opening ritual and the Grand Chapter of Missouri was honored for his service to the Fraternity. The Candidates exalted at this class received the best of ritual from the Companions. VEC Jack E. Timmons, Grand Lecturer had summoned Companions from all parts of Missouri to confer the degrees.

I was honored by Caldwell Chapter No. 53 with an assist from Putnam Chapter No. 123 with a reception for me and Lady Karen on November 21, 2015. There were approximately 70 people in attendance. Caldwell Chapter No. 53 members had asked me for several years to become a dual member of their Chapter. I would respond, if you become a dual member of Putnam No. 123 then I will become a member of Caldwell Chapter No. 53. I never had a Companion of Caldwell Chapter No. 53 agree to those terms! I can no longer make that request

as I was made an Endowed member of Caldwell Chapter No. 53 by their membership that day, a humbling honor not expected by me.

When presenting the Masonic Youth groups with our donations to them I wondered why the check was so small. I learned that in 1998-1999 that the check presented was \$1,000.00. This past year our check was \$300.00, much smaller you can see. Anyone who has investments knows income on them is down, and so is ours for the Grand Chapter's Foundation. I discussed with the next four Grand Chapter Line Officers the possibility of having a Grand High Priest coin to raise money, 50% of the proceeds to the Foundation and 50% divided among the three Masonic Youth Groups each year. Agreement was unanimous and coins were designed. I received my first 100 GHP coins on November 21, 2015 and by February 20, 2016 they were all sold and another 100 were ordered. I thank all who donated to this cause. Your generous donations will be appreciated by the Missouri Masonic Youth Organizations.

I was saddened to accept the resignation of VEC Jerry Bradford from the Grand Chapter advancing line effective June 8, 2016. VEC Jerry has moved to Texas and is unable to fulfill his obligations to the Grand Chapter of Missouri. His ritual knowledge and leadership will be missed in Missouri.

Memorial Service

Isaiah 43:1-3: But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.

At the time of the preaching of Isaiah, Israel was in the midst of the greatest trial of her existence. She had been subdued by a foreign power, and had been forced into captivity at the hands of a hostile nation. For almost two generations, she had remained in Babylon, but finally God heard her cries, and he sent this prophet to tell the people that her time of servitude was nearing its completion, and that she would return home. These words are a promise of the salvation that Israel would one day, very soon, receive.

They are words which were spoken and prayed long before the prophet used them. They are words of great assurance that God will do all that he has promised. We live by these words. We trust in them that God will fulfill all that he has spoken to us through faith, through life, through our friends and companions. They are words of great rejoicing, which is how we feel when we are joined together in the fellowship of the Fraternity.

We mourn the passing of 111 companions and Past Grand High Priests Delbert R. Gentry and Calvin D. Schroff, taken from us during this past year. Our Chapters are less because of their absence, because we no longer can delight in their company and conversation and their fellowship, but we have these promises of God's salvation.

The nation of Israel held this same trust. Faithful people of all generations have known these promises to be true. Though we are called to pass through this time, we do so with the assurance that God is with us, and that one day, our tears will be turned to joy. This comes simply because God loves us, and he loves all his children.

God is present with us, and trusts that we will take comfort in that, for we need to remember that life does indeed go on, not only in the world to come, but in this world also; that when we are in the midst of the waters or the fire, we are not alone.

Let us pray. Gracious and merciful God, we once again entrust our departed companions to your care. We pray for your comfort and strength to be with their families and dear ones, and to be with us, that we may go forward to continue the witness of the joys and service we all share. We ask all this to the honor and glory of your holy name. Amen.

Recommendations

I recommend the continuation of the Traveling Keystone started by MEC Stephen Monrotus. This program promotes visitation between Chapters and provides Chapters the ability to perform and grow.

I recommend that the GHP coins be continued as a way to increase our donations to the Missouri Masonic Youth Organizations. These you men and women represent the future of Masonry. The young men of the DeMolay will become Master Masons. They will become our leaders one day, shaping Masonry for their generation and into the future. The young ladies of Jobs Daughters and Rainbow for Girls having been a part of our Masonic family will promote Masonry's benefits to their husbands someday. If he is not a part of our Masonic family I believe he soon will be. His Lady promoting our Fraternity in a positive Light to him and recommending he belong.

I recommend that a long range plan be established, setting measurable goals of where we want our Grand Chapter and the Subordinate Chapters to be in five years. Those Goals should include increasing membership, increasing ritual proficiency, and other goals that would promote and grow our Fraternity.

I have tried numerous times since January of this year to contact a representative of Lone Star Chapter No. 30 RAM located in Chillicothe, MO without much success. I have left messages for a return phone call without receiving any. I did get to speak with the Secretary on one occasion and suggested he contact the membership for a meeting with me. He was less than serious, even laughing at a need to meet with representatives of the Grand Chapter. Since that conversation I have been unable to make any contact with this Chapter or the Secretary. They have not filed an annual return or paid per-capita since 2011 and their 990's have not been filed. I recommend that their assets be frozen, their Charter suspended and a committee of oversight be appointed to establish what the wishes are of the membership of this Chapter and a report submitted to the Grand High Priest of their findings. I would prefer this rather than arresting their Charter as this Chapter represents a major portion of the state of MO.

I recommend that the Round Robin Event be continued and expanded. This is a way to promote our ritual and assure that there are Companions who can perform the ritual without aide of the book. The pilot event this year was a huge success and those in attendance expressed that it should continue. I want to congratulate EC Frank Lukenbill, the winner of the first ever Round Robin event. He received a Life Endowment to his Chapter as his reward.

I also recommend that the Ritual proficiency card program be re-started. This program has been non-existent for a few years. This is another program which assures we have Companions throughout the state proficient in the Ritual. Our Ritual needs to be revived and preserved.

Closing Comments

I thank every Royal Arch Mason in our great state of Missouri who supported me this year. I hope that history will show my year was a good one. I also want to thank all the Chapters in Missouri who invited me to visit them and gave me one of their Chapter's Pennies as a keepsake. It has been a Great but Humbling Honor to Serve the Companions of Missouri this year. Lady Karen and I have been blessed with having the help, support and positive feedback of those around us, Companions and their Ladies that we can always call friends!

LEGISLATION FOR ACTION AT GRAND CHAPTER CONVOCATION IN 2016

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri Greetings:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: ARTICLE VII, Sections 34, 35, 36 & 37 of the By-laws of the Grand Chapter be amended by inserting the following:

- a. "Regional and" in the title of ARTICLE VII;
- b. "and two Regional Grand Lecturers so that one Regional Grand Lecturer would service that part of the State lying West of U. S. Highway 63 and one Regional Grand Lecturer would service that part of the State lying East of U. S. Highway 63." following the word "region" in the first sentence of Section 34.
- c. "Regional Grand Lecturers and" between "The" and "District" in the second sentence of Section 34;

- d. "Additional duties of the Regional Grand Lecturers shall be to follow the direction of the Grand Lecturer, plan and execute ritual schools within their respective regions, and to assist and provide instruction and leadership to the District Deputy Grand Lecturers" after "practiced" in Section 34;
- e. "Regional Grand Lecturers" between "Lecturer," and "and" in the first sentence of Section 35;
- f. "the Regional Grand Lecturers" between "himself" and "and" in Section 36;
- g. ", Regional Grand Lecturers" between "Lecturers" and "or" in Section 37; and,
- h. amend date to each Section if adopted.

THIS ARTICLE CURRENT READS: ARTICLE VII District Deputy Grand Lecturers

Section 34. *Duties*. The Grand High Priest shall appoint a District Deputy Grand Lecturer to each established district in each established region. The District Deputy Grand lecturers shall have in special care the work, as approved by the Grand Chapter, and shall see that no other work is taught or practiced. (*Amended April 29, 1975, Amended May 18, 2001*)

Section 35. *Ritual Committee.* The ritual committee shall be composed of the Grand Lecturer, and District Deputy Grand Lecturers, including ex-officio members, and chaired by the Grand Lecturer. The ritual committee shall meet periodically at a location to be designated by the Chairman for the purpose of reviewing and maintaining ritualistic perfection. Any changes in ritual and/or procedures suggested by the ritual committee must be presented to and approved by the Grand Chapter before such changes become mandatory. *(Amended April 29, 1975, Amended May 9, 1998, Amended May 18, 2001)*

Section 36. Annual Report. The Grand Lecturer shall make annually a report to the Grand Chapter of all official duties performed by himself and the District Deputy Grand Lecturers, along with the actions of the Ritual Committee. (Amended April 29, 1975, Amended May 18, 2001)

Section 37. *Compensation.* No salary will be paid to the Grand Lecturer or to District Deputy Grand Lecturers. Other compensation will be as determined by the Grand High Priest and the Finance Committee. (Amended April 29, 1975, May 18, 2001)

AS AMENDED, THIS SECTION WOULD READ: ARTICLE VII Regional and District Deputy Grand Lecturers

Section 34. Duties. The Grand High Priest shall appoint a District Deputy Grand Lecturer to each established district in each established region and two Regional Grand Lecturers so that one Regional Grand Lecturer would service that part of the State lying West of U. S. Highway 63 and one Regional Grand Lecturer would service that part of the State lying East of U. S. Highway 63. Any changes in ritual and/or procedures suggested by the ritual committee must be presented to and approved by the Grand Chapter before such changes become mandatory. (Amended April 29, 1975, Amended May 9, 1998, Amended May 18, 2001)

Section 36. Annual Report. The Grand Lecturer shall make annually a report to the Grand Chapter of all official duties performed by himself, the Regional Grand Lecturers and the District Deputy Grand Lecturers, along with the actions of the Ritual Committee. (Amended April 29, 1975, Amended May 18, 2001)

Section 37. Compensation. No salary will be paid to the Grand Lecturer, Regional Grand Lecturers or to District Deputy Grand Lecturers. Other compensation will be as determined by the Grand High Priest and the Finance Committee.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: To provide assistance to the Grand Lecturer in the planning and execution of ritual schools of instruction.

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri Greetings:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: the By-laws of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Missouri be amended by addition of **Section 159**. *Missouri Chapter No. 0*. at **ARTICLE XVI** *Membership*, to wit,

- 1. Missouri Chapter No. 0 will be formed upon adoption of this legislation by the Grand Chapter. This Chapter will function aside from the usual requirements prescribed for the issuance of a Charter.
- 2. A Charter shall be issued to the office of Grand High Priest and be held by him while he remains in office.
- 3. The Executive Officers of the Chapter shall be the Grand High Priest, the Grand King, and the Grand Scribe.
- 4. The Treasurer and Secretary will be appointed by the Grand High Priest each year and may be reappointed to successive terms if necessary. The Treasurer and Secretary will perform duties as would be performed by a regularly chartered Chapter including the maintenance of all

membership records and shall provide a written report to the Grand Chapter at the Annual Convocation.

- 5. The territorial jurisdiction of such Chapter when formed shall be coextensive with the territorial jurisdiction of this Grand Chapter.
- 6. The membership shall consist of those Companions who shall have lost membership in a regular Chapter. Membership shall be transferred to Missouri Chapter No. 0 when a Chapter closes for any reason, unless by lawful consolidation with a currently existing Chapter.
- 7. Missouri Chapter No. 0 shall be of limited purposes only and shall have the right, power, and authority:
- a. To Collect Grand Chapter per capita together with a \$ per Companion fee for expenses. Officers of the Chapter shall not be assessed per capita.
- b. To issue demits and/or letters of good standing upon the request of the Companion by the authority of the Grand High Priest.
- c. To have such rights and authority as may be necessary to carry on such work. The Chapter shall not have the authority to confer degrees.
- d. For the purposes of carrying out such rights, powers, and authority, it shall follow the Code of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri.
- 8. Neither its designation as a Chapter or its organization as such, nor the issuance of Charter shall constitute, or be construed as giving to it or any of its officers or members, any of the Masonic honors, rights, powers, privileges, or authority possessed by a Royal Arch Chapter or by any of its officers or members, except such as are already held by them by service in their former Chapter.
- 9. No person shall continue to be a member of Missouri Chapter No. 0 unless he is a Master Mason in good standing in a recognized, chartered Lodge of Master Masons.
- 10. No person may remain a member of Missouri Chapter No. 0 longer than five years after which he shall either immediately affiliate with another Chapter or request a demit. The five-year time period may be extended by the Grand High Priest upon majority vote approval of the Grand Chapter.
- 11. (a) Missouri Chapter No. 0 shall be empowered to hold the Charter of any Chapter whose membership is incapable of performing all of the work ordinarily expected of an active Chapter or may not completely satisfy the Code of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri but does not wish to surrender its Charter or have its Charter arrested by the Grand Chapter. The Charter would not necessarily have to be removed from the Chapter's current meeting place.
- (b) Such Chapter will still be allowed to hold regular meetings, receive and induct candidates, and elect officers (except Secretary and Treasurer) however, its administrative functions, i.e. files and records maintenance, funds handling, etc., will become the duty of the Secretary and Treasurer appointed by the Grand High Priest. The Chapter may have business sessions and make decisions regarding fund raising, donations, etc.

- (c) A Chapter falling under this section may reclaim its Charter at any future period by demonstrating to the Grand Chapter that it is once again capable of handling its own affairs.
- (d) Such Chapter shall provide a list of current members and officers to the appointed Secretary when requesting to fall under this section.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE: The legislation is intended to provide a repository and serve as a holding entity for Chapters that are not quite able to satisfy the requirements of our law. There are existing Chapters in the jurisdiction that have much difficulty opening meetings because of the lack of a quorum. And, even though current law permits visitors to count for the quorum, it is sometimes difficult for those visitors to attend due to other commitments and distance to travel. By not arresting the Charter, such Chapters would be allowed to continue business not necessarily having a quorum.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri:

Companions, on behalf of the Committee on Finance as its Chairman, I am proud to submit the following proposed budget for the 2016-2017 Capitular year. This budget is a result of a long and ultimately successful meeting on April 2, 2016 of the Committee on Finance and ratified by the officers of the Grand Chapter on April 13, 2016.

This budget, to balance, will require a one-time transfer from the Unrestricted Fund \$3300.00 and is based on the following key estimates; first, income based on 2000 per capita paying Royal Arch Masons out of the estimated 2871 on the rolls. There are an estimated 2781 members, however, due to remittances, endowed and 50 year members on which per capita is not paid, they therefore cannot be counted as income of the Grand Chapter. The membership income accounts are therefore reflective of that fact, and second, to relate to that income position expenses had to be pared to address that reality. Accordingly, significant reductions of necessity were made and, at the instance of the Grand Secretary, a signal, appropriate and highly necessary change was made to the manner of payment to the Grand Secretary. Heretofore a flat salary was budgeted, now due to the realities of the day, it will be \$2.00 per member on the rolls of the Grand Chapter based on the previous year's annual return statistical report, and calculated as of March 31 from those returns. The committee commends the Grand Secretary for both the realization and the recommendation.

With the \$3,000.00 shortfall this year and projected losses next year of 7%, our projected per capita income for 2017-2018 will be \$35,280.00. With no further room to cut expenses, this will leave us with a projected deficit budget in 2017-2018 of another \$10,500.00. Although it should be realistically suggested that another \$5.00 per capita increase should be presented from the floor this year to account for the future 2017-2018 budget shortfall, with the knowledge that we just had a \$5.00 increase, the committee did not feel that another increase would be supported at this time, however necessary and urgent it is now.

In short, facing the realities of our current situation is what your Committee on Finance was required by the business necessity of budgeting to do and it did its duty. We commend it to you with our best wishes and efforts.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE/INVESTMENT

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri:

The Investment Committee of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Missouri met on February 4, 2016 at the Lone Star Steak House in Columbia, Missouri.

Present: John Siscel, E. Allen Kohler, Donald Trabue and Gail Turner. John Siscel called the meeting to order.

- (A) The Grand Treasurer, Donald Trabue distributed copies of detailed information for the General Fund, Endowed Membership Fund, Foundation Fund, Palmyra Fund, Supply Fund, Triennial Fund, Leadership Fund and Proceedings Fund. Balances shown were as of January 31, 2016.
- (B) The Grand Treasurer reported that following the directive from the last committee meeting he had made contact with Central Bank of Jefferson City as to how their Investor Services could assist with Grand Chapter funds. Following their review of his existing practices with these funds, he received assurances that their returns with the same investment guidelines would be similar to what we had now. There would be a fee for their services.
- (C) The Committee reviewed the current practices of the Grand Treasurer and found his procedures to continue to be clearly defined, well justified, and appropriate. He also assured the committee that he remained comfortable handling the investments and had taken steps recommended for contingency planning and safekeeping of Grand Chapter records.
- (D) The Grand Treasurer reported that he is now storing offsite a digital copy of the financial files with an appointed assistant for access and safe keeping.
- (E) It was recognized that all funds except for the Foundation Fund had a diversified mix of investments, which the Grand Treasurer justified with references to the mandate for adequate income for budgeted annual draws (equities do not guarantee an income), and with the generally accepted strategy of keeping equities within 50% of overall fund balances.

(F) It is the recommendation of this committee that annual resolutions be obtained from each York Rite Masonic Body of Missouri being represented by the Grand Chapter (as well as the Grand York Rite itself) naming the current officers authorized to represent and manage the financial affairs for and on behalf of their respective Body (organization).

No further business appearing the meeting was adjourned.

REPORTS OF THE GRAND SECRETARY

To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri:

Companions, much has been done, and there is much yet to do. Following this narrative, you will find the statistical reports of the Grand Secretary's office. It would be of benefit to the grand officers and others to actually review and study these reports as they provide much information as to the overall financial and physical health of the subordinate Chapters of the Grand Chapter of Missouri.

Over the years, with the changing of subordinate Secretaries and changes in technology, with what might have once been considered usual and customary communicative protocol, we are experiencing a loss of understanding of Masonic protocol with regard to sending official correspondence to the Office of the Grand High Priest and his committees. Sometimes when things change, some things need to remain the same. Chapter Secretaries are sending requests for Dispensations and By-Laws changes directly to the Grand High Priest or Jurisprudence Committee. We would urge and respectfully request that normalized communications be reinstated – by sending your requests to the Grand Secretary's office wherein they will be appropriately distributed and tracked through to completion. We find this necessary when documenting and approving actions to be properly recorded by all involved.

Unfortunately, we have not tackled the task of reviewing Capitular Commissions and anticipate this moving forward over the next year.

Annual Returns: This year fourteen returns were received late this year: St. Charles Missouri 1; Liberty 3; Springfield 15 (serious health issues); Sedalia 18 (due to extenuating circumstances); Macon 22 (serious health issues); Jefferson City 34; Tyrian 52 (serious health

issues); Meridian Sun 61 (serious health issues); Trenton 66; Oriental-Rabboni 78; Bethany 80; Joplin 91; Triune 93; and East Gate 136. Although not properly recorded on the annual return, one Royal Arch Mason was expelled this year.

Of critical note, on September 5, 2015, each Subordinate Chapter, Grand Officer, District Deputy Grand Officer and Past Grand High Priest was officially informed of the increase in the 2016 Grand Chapter per capita. I am aware of several Chapter Secretaries who either simply failed to read and understand the communication, present it to the officers and members of their Chapters, or ignored it in whole as they did not affect action to increase the annual dues charged and collected beginning January 1, 2016. Grand Chapter per capita for 2016, due with your 2016 Annual Returns will be \$19.60. It is not appropriate for Chapters to attempt to wait to collect 2017 dues in order to be able to pay 2016 per capita. If Chapters are operating this way, you are causing your Chapters serious financial harm and it is entirely inappropriate.

Endowed Members: Some Secretaries seem to voice concern about how Grand Chapter Endowed Memberships and General Grand Chapter Endowments are calculated. Most of these concerns would be alleviated with a simple read-through of the Annual Return Instructions with regard to those items. Our office remains willing and able to address any questions you might have about the completion of the returns.

Audits: I would direct the Grand Officers' (as well as appropriate committees) attention to several items in the statistical reports – Chapters who report no Cash on Hand; no Paraphernalia value; Chapters who show an indebtedness; and Chapters whose dues are extremely low or even less than Grand Chapter per capita. Several Chapters failed to record the amount of their annual dues. DDGHP's should take notice of those Chapters who failed to record any RARA donations and provide education. It would appear that we have lost track of the Penny-a-Day stickers the office provides for these charity donations. Finally, I would refer to the Grand High Priest and appropriate committees the list of Treasurers and Secretaries who are not bonded, and whose Chapters failed to submit an annual audit. We must start reviewing and addressing these statistical reports and what appears to be failures on the part of the Chapters, although we are sure most of these items could be remediated through training and education for the officers by the appropriate Grand Chapter officers.

One final note about Annual Returns and Monthly Reports – Secretaries are reminded to record the full names of members they are reporting. Nicknames and Initials are not acceptable. The Grand Secretary's office would appreciate attention be given to properly recording membership information and work with us to correct both sets of records.

This year, the Grand York Rite web site underwent a complete makeover and background rebuild under the design and engineering of our web master. We also updated our social media notifications. We extend to E.C. Donald MacCormick our most sincere appreciation for his hard work and dedication. Such devotion must not go unrewarded. We encourage everyone to "subscribe" to the Grand York Rite email distribution list and Like us on Facebook so you can receive the timeliest notices. Additionally, the newly revised Calendar of Events is open to

everyone to post their events of import, Official Visits by Grand Officers, and especially degree work which will be moderated and if approved by the committee members, posted usually in less than 24 hours. There are a number of very useful forms and documents located under the Document Library which I would direct everyone to. If you find something missing, let me know and we will bring it up to date and post it for everyone's use.

Monthly Reports: Many Chapter Secretaries are not filling out monthly reports. This next year, updates will be provided monthly to the Grand High Priest and DDGHP's as to those who are not providing these reports. Companions, the timely and accurate submission of Monthly Reports will make your efforts in completing the Annual Returns a breeze. We have created an easy to use form that will be just as useful to you as it is to us. There was one minor fix applied this year thanks to the watchful eye of the Secretary of Poplar Bluff Chapter No. 114 and the Secretary of Caldwell Chapter No. 53.

On another and probably sensitive note, the list of missing committee reports in the preliminary proceedings is long and distinguished, not to mention embarrassing and unprofessional. The Grand Secretary's office sets a deadline for the submission of committee reports and other documents which are to be printed in the preliminary proceedings. We are unsure if the committees are functioning but the lack of reporting should be referred to the incoming Grand High Priest for remediation. The result of this lack of submission and of untimely submissions of reports generates much in the way of chaos in preparing for the grand sessions. On another note, it is imperative that the Education Committee for 2016-2017 immediately update the Distinguished Chapter Award Application and provide it to the Grand Secretary's office and the DDGHP's as soon as possible following the Annual Convocation.

On the subject of our storage facilities, due to a renewed working relationship with the Grand Lodge of Missouri and the Missouri Lodge of Research, R.:.E.:.C.:. Hanson and I have started cleaning out the downtown Columbia storage facility. The Missouri Lodge of Research has graciously agreed to store and even properly display some of our historic artifacts and documents. We have already taken one truckload to the Grand Lodge building. Over the next two months, we hope to completely vacate this facility. Then we hope to start migrating storage items from the Columbia Masonic Lodge to the Lodge of Research. Most Worshipful Brother John W.F. Hess has been most accommodating to the Grand York Rite and we wish to thank him and MWB C. Brent Stewart for helping to finally bring all of this together. Hopefully, in the very near future, some of the Grand York Rite's most historic and important documents and items will be on display for all to see.

This year, Debbie Hanson was trained in and is now making full membership database changes as they occur, processing monthly reports and reconciling annual returns from the past several years in an attempt to finally reconcile our membership records with the records of the subordinate chapters. Additionally, we have restored communications with the Royal Arch Mason Magazine membership listing manager and are making changes every day to correct many outstanding deficiencies. This office would not function without her dedication. She is to

be commended for her tireless efforts and her willingness to help us all get things back on track, as well as keep me on track with things I have let slip. I also thank REC Russell S. Hanson for his assistance in continuing the business partnership that the leadership of the Grand York Rite agreed to when we developed the current business plan. I could not do this job without him.

Finally, this year I was able to attend all but one of the Regional York Rite Conferences. It was apparent from the feedback that my attendance was productive and warranted. I appreciate the opportunity to participate and look forward to attending future conferences if invited to participate.

With so many changes in Secretaries and in some cases a loss of institutional knowledge, some have suggested that the Grand Secretary develop a training program which can be given during Regional York Rite Conferences, and possibly even develop a full blown training session at our next grand sessions. This would be a great opportunity for us to share with new (and old) Secretaries background information and guidance in how to maintain membership records, communicate with the grand bodies, communicate with other Chapters, and even potentially provide education and instruction on how to conduct routine administrative functions which have been lost to time or simply not handed down to our most dedicated Companions. We encourage feedback as to your need for such a program.

Companions: On April 20, 2016 your committee on Returns of Chapters obtained the information in this report. We DID NOT physically examine the returns, but received the information from Debbie Hanson, Grand Secretary's Assistant.

Of the 44 Chapters there were 32 annual returns turned into the Grand Secretary's office. Most of the returns were completed neatly and on time. A few left some information incomplete such as the amount of dues or the timing of meetings. A few neglected to include the last page which contains information about an audit and signatures. One Chapter mailed in the recapitulation sheet and check ONLY. This is not acceptable and will return the sheet and HOLD the check. All late returns will be assessed penalties when received.

This year there were several new Secretaries who took over the job. There were a couple who had surgery and that kept them from getting returns in on time.

At the beginning of the year there were 2937 members. There are 299 members with 50 or more years of membership.

There is 372 endowed, and 126 had remitted dues.

It is difficult to make a report with nearly 30% of Chapters delinquent in filing their returns.

REPORT OF AUDIT COMMITTEE

To the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of the State of Missouri

Greetings: The Chair of the Audit Committee was made privy to the findings of the Investment Committee chaired by the most notable Grand King, Right Excellent Companion John W. Siscel III. It is most obvious that the Investment Committee has previously received suitable instruction and passed a satisfactory proficiency from the Audit Committee. That indicated by the comments made by the Grand King which we, with permission, admittedly plagiarize and see fit to include in this report:

The Committee reviewed the current practices of the Grand Treasurer and found his procedures to continue to be clearly defined, well justified, and appropriate. He also assured the committee that he remained comfortable handling the investments and had taken steps recommended for contingency planning and safekeeping of Grand Chapter records.

The Grand Treasurer reported that he is now storing offsite a digital copy of the financial files with an appointed assistant for access and safe keeping.

It was recognized that all funds except for the Foundation Fund had a diversified mix of investments, which the Grand Treasurer justified with references to the mandate for adequate income for budgeted annual draws (equities do not guarantee an income), and with the generally accepted strategy of keeping equities within 50% of overall fund balances.

The Audit Committee, after due and diligent similar reviews conducted over the years, has come to the same conclusions many, many times. This Committee has, from time to time, observed minor infractions of reporting. These have included funds improperly credited to an incorrect account, transposed figures, warrants not documented or improperly documented, etc., none of which affected the money line to any significant degree and which were immediately and without objection corrected.

This Committee's direction in this and previous examinations, as explicitly stated, was always, the creditability of the office holders of the Grand Secretary/Recorder and the Grand Treasurer and not a specific dollars and cents review although much of that occurred as well. This review was no exception.

In previous times it was occasionally appropriate to step on toes, sometimes with force. Over time, a pattern of mutual trust, respect and agreement developed between the Offices and the Committee whereby this Committee was taught protocol and procedure that has transcended time and served to allow understanding of processes.

We would be most remiss if we did not recognize the new plan, that being, offering those records and files necessary to an audit to be available in a protected online atmosphere thereby eliminating, for the most part, extensive and in some cases expensive travel and lengthy and sometimes boring meetings. While not quite as good as an in person power point presentation could be, it is useful and satisfactory. Inclusion of instructional material was a big boon.

To reiterate a previous finding of this Committee, it is recognized that the policies, practices, protocols, logging and documentation of the Grand Secretary/Recorder and Grand Treasurer do not follow any recognized generally accepted accounting procedures, but, those processes utilized accomplish the same mission. The bottom line is one will be very hard pressed to locate any evidence of fraud or embezzlement or other misuse of funds by these named officers.

Unfortunately, not every member of this Committee contributed to its review or this response. That demonstrates a general lack of accountability and leadership on their part and should be a modicum of concern for the Grand Chapter of Missouri.
